ood afternoon everyone and welcome to the Stanmore Group Stadium for today's SCEFL Premier Division game against Punjab United.

We hope that our visitors enjoy their visit to Bayliss Avenue enjoy their afternoon and have a safe journey back after the game.

This is the first chance we have had to congratulate them on their Kent Senior Trophy win last season - a great achievement for the club.

Our FA Cup journey ended in our last home game as we lost 2-1 to Burgess Hill Town after extra-time.

It was a case of what might have been after we missed several chances to re-gain the lead, before Burgess Hill took the one chance that came their way in extra-time.

The players couldn't have given more on the night and there was lots to be encouraged by.

Last week at Glebe we were second best in the first half and it looked a long way back when we went in 2-0 down at half-time.

Woody made three changes at halftime and it worked as we looked more aggressive and positive after the break. One of those changes, Ollie Milton, showed a striker's instinct to follow up Harry Taylor's saved effort to pull one back.

He then put in a cross from the left that eluded everyone to sneak in a the far post and make it 2-2.

That is four goals in four League games from Ollie who showed great attitude on coming off the bench.

Rajan Sahni also came off the bench to make his Dockers debut.

Woody tried to bring Rajan in from Kennington in pre-season but was beaten to it by Phoenix Sports, and he has come in on month's loan.

Welcome to Rajan, who we hope enjoys his stay here, and thanks to Phoenix Sports for allowing him to come.

In the London Senior Cup, we have been drawn at home to Dulwich Hamlet, with the winners at home to AFC Wimbledon or Sporting Bengal.

Our League Cup tie at home to Tooting Bec will be played on Tuesday 31st October.

HISTORY - PUNJAB UNITED



unjab United was founded in 2003 and although the club name may suggest otherwise, Punjab United FC is open to members and players "regardless of age, race, religion, sexual orientation or ability".

The club first affiliated to the Kent County FA in 2003 as part of current Chairman/Manager Jugiit 'Chipie' Sian's, secretary Jindi Banwait's, Ajit 'Sonny' Sian's and Navin Pal plan to bring a more entertaining brand of football with an ethical approach to youth and senior football in the Grayesend area.

The club applied for membership to join the Kent County League Premier Division where in their inaugural season they won the Kent Intermediate Challenge Cup, were finalists in the Kent County League Cup, but more importantly were crowned the 2016-2017 League Champions.

This success meant promotion to the SCEFL First Division where, remarkably, they again became champions by finishing 2017-18 on top of the table and earning a place in the Premier Division.

A lot of work went on off the pitch to get the ground at Elite Venue ready as a lot of the facilities were outside the main ground at Elite Venue.

Promotion to step 5 saw the club enter the FA Vase for the first time in 2018-19, beating Lydd Town 2-1 in their first ever tie, before losing 9-8 on penalties to Steyning Association after a 1-1 draw.

The step up in leagues meant positive results were now much harder to achieve, and relegation looked distinctly possible for much of the campaign. The final finish in 17th place of 20 made survival look a lot more clearcut than it had at times.

The club was 12 points above the second relegated club.

The season of struggle had, however, provided an interesting narrative for the BBC to use in their documentary about the team, which was filmed as the club progressed. The programme part of the 'Our Lives' series was nominated in the 'best single documentary' category at the Royal Television Society Awards. It may not have won, but it brought a lot of positive attention to the club

The following season proved to be one of the most difficult for the club (and world) as Coronavrius took it's grip early in 2020 and the season was curtailed with nearly a quarter of the fixtures left to play.

The season had started on a positive note as the BBC chose our first ever FA Cup game as it's live match on iPlayer and the red button service.

Unfortunately it ended in a 1-0 defeat at home to Broadbridge Heath in front of 204 spectators, but it provided more publicity for the club.

Their second FA Vase campaign was more successful as they beat Selsey 5-0 and Loxwood 3-2 at home before going out 3-0 at Newhaven in the first round proper, the first time they had reached that stage.

When the season ended they stood 16th in the League from 19 games, but that season was wiped from the records, meaning it counted for nothing.

The biggest impact on the club though was the death of stalwart groundsman Steve 'Cookie' Cook in 2020. His cropped hair and toothless grin made him immediately recognisable around the club and the town.

After working for the club for over four years, and being a valued member behind the scenes, the decision was taken to rename the ground the Steve Cook Stadium ahead of the 2020-21 season.

Steve is well remembered for his community work in Gravesend and his extended family often watch the team and raise a glass to him at what was almost his home, such were the hours he put in on our behalf.

The 2020-21 season was another cut short by Coronavirus, as they managed only twelve League games, winning four and drawing one before the curtain fell prematurely once again.

In the FA Cup they went out 4-3 on penalties to Stansfeld after an entertaining 3-3 draw, in what was their first ever match in the competition.

In the FA Vase they beat Bearsted 5-3 on penalties before going out 3-2 to Horley Town in the 2nd qualifying round.

The season was over by the first week of November and they wouldn't play again until special dispensation from the FA allowed clubs to play friendlies from May 2021.

To make up for the loss of income since November 2020 their friends from Chatham Town invited Punjab United, Sheppey United, Lordswood and Rochester United (all of the SCEFL) to take part in a round robin friendly tournament, which eventually became the Kent Sports Podcast Trophy.

The clubs were to play each other home and away with the top two then playing the final at Chatham's Bauvill Stadium at Maidstone Road. Fans who had been starved of their football fix turned out in droves for these games as there was no competition from the professional leagues.

Plenty of Groundhoppers from all over the UK

as well as a few from overseas were in evidence as all the clubs drew big crowds for what were essentially friendlies.

Notable results saw them draw 3-3 at Chatham in front of 450 fans and win 8-0 at Lordswood, their biggest win in any match. The final saw Chatham beat Sheppey 8-7 on penalties after a 2-2 draw in front of 1087 fans.

Immediately after preparations began for 2021-22 and they finished a creditable fifteenth, a comfortable seventeen points above the relegation places.

The 2022-23 season saw us achieve a best ever finish of tenth in the 20 team division.

Their greatest achievement however came at Maidstone United's Gallagher Stadium as they beat Deal Town 6-0 in the Kent Senior Trophy Final.

Punjab United have achieved a lot in twenty years and their ethos remains the same as the day they were founded.

It is best summed up in three words: **Pride**, **Passion**, **Punjab**.


