aving successfully negotiated three cup ties without conceding a goal, we make a return to SCEFL Premier Division action this afternoon.

Eight wins and a draw from nine games has been a magnificent effort from the players and management team and we will go into 2024 competing on four fronts.

The focus and effort to do that can't be underestimated, but as always we will need to maintain that as we welcome the players, officials and supporters of Hollands & Blair to the Stanmore Stadium.

The Gillingham-based side always provide a competitive opposition and this afternoon will be no different.

After the FA Vase win last week, we progressed in the Challenge Cup on Tuesday with a 3-0 win at home to Rusthall.

While the first half did little to warm the spirits on a freezing night, Ladic Melconian set us on our way with a superb opportunist goal four minutes after half-time.

James Dyer put the matter beyond doubt with a well taken goal before Harry Taylor rounded off a well worked corner by heading a third goal nine minutes from time.

The FA Vase fourth round draw has given us an away tie to Hilltop or Hamble Club who meet this afternoon following the postponement of their tie last weekend.

Hilltop are based in Ruislip and play in the Combined Counties League Premier Division, while Hamble play in the Wessex League Premier Division and are based in the village of Hamble-le-Rice near Southampton.

After today we have a rare midweek off before travelling to Bearsted next Saturday.

While we have no more midweek games in December, that is likely to change drastically in the New Year with four home games to be re-arranged (by coincidence none of our away games have been affected).

One game that has been is our home game against Fisher, which will be played on Tuesday 2nd January.

On the player front, James Trueman will have benefitted from a full 90 minutes on Tuesday after his recent injury.

Jake Lovell was able to return from the substitutes bench after a nasty foot injury sustained in the Peacehaven game which required ten stitches.

While he is some way from fitness, it was good to see Louie Clarke able to join the warm up on Tuesday evening.

Jamie Miller has had a bug that has kept him out of the last two games, and Sam Smith was also unwell on Tuesday. Hopefully both will be available today.

While today is our designated Christmas fixture, we are at home again on the 23rd December when Sutton Athletic visit.

Enjoy the game today and please get behind the team.

HISTORY - HOLLANDS & BLAIR



t was in 1967 that a Twydall-based factory team named Hollands & Blair started out.

The club won the Rochester & District League Division Five in 1968-69, following that up with the Division Three title the following season.

In 1970, the club as it is now, was formed under the banner of H&B United and they began life in Division Six.

At the end of that first campaign H&B United finished ninth having collected 20 points (eight wins and four draws) from their 24 games.

The original side continued their upward spiral, winning the Rochester & District League Division Two title in 1971–72 and they followed that up by being runners-up in Division One the next season (1972-73).

Then in 1973 the two clubs merged, initially on a first team/reserve team basis but after just one season the Blair first team folded and H&B chose to continue under the Hollands & Blair name, competing in Division Four for the 1974-75 campaign.

That season saw Blair end as runnersup to Fleur having lost just once, and record a 17-1 victory at Borden.

Promotions continued in the next two campaigns, finishing runners-up in Division Two (1975–76) and then Division One in1976–77. It was following this promotion that the club stayed in the Premier Division for 17 years, winning the championship twice and finishing runners-up three times.

The 2003-04 campaign saw the club reach new heights, winning a treble.

They lifted a fourth Rochester & District League Premier Division title success, their second on the bounce, plus the Kent Junior Cup Group A and the Quarter Century Cup. It was at the end of this season that the club gained promotion into the Kent County Football League where they were to start in Division Two Fast.

The step up proved no major obstacle as Blair reached Kent County Football League Premier Division for the 2006-07 campaign.

Their first Premier title came in 2008–09, when they also won the Inter Regional Challenge Cup for the first time when defeating Orpington 2-1 after extra-time at Tunbridge Wells. The treble was completed with Kent Intermediate Challenge Shield, another 2-1 victory but this time against Rusthall at Chatham Town.

They retained the cup the following season, this time beating Fleet Leisure 2-0 in the final but they were to finish second in the league. However they did become champions once again in 2010–11.

The 2011-12 saw Blair invited to be one of sixteen teams who formed the Kent Invicta League.

They also lifted the Kent Senior Trophy after a 2-1 win against Sevenoaks Town at Welling United.

Successive Kent Invicta League title wins / Last season Blair started the season at saw the club promoted to the Southern Counties East League for the 2016-17 season.

An impressive first season saw Hollands & Blair lead the table before finishing as runners-up to Greenwich Borough.

While the club haven't reached those heights again in the League, Scott Porter's appointment in October 2021

took an upward trajectory with the club reaching the Kent Senior Trophy Final against SCEFL Champions Sheppey United.

Having led for most of the game, Blair were unlucky to lose 2-1 in extra-time.

Lordswood while a 3G pitch was laid at Star Meadow.

Having returned to their home, the club marked the improvements by reaching the SCEFL Challenge Cup Final where two goals from club stalwart Ben Brown saw them beat Fisher 2-1 at Whitstable Town

SCEFL - ROUND-UP



Monday's FA Vase draw resulted in home ties for our fellow SCEFL clubs Deal Town and Holmesdale.

Deal Town will welcome Cobham to the Kent coast, with Holmesdale entertaining Highworth Town.

The ties, along with our trip to Hilltop or Hamble Club will be played on Saturday 14th January.

Holmesdale also reached the Challenge Cup quarter-final on Tuesday evening after winning 5-4 on penalties at Punjab United.

Sam Bayford's first half spot kick put the Dalers ahead, but Lea Dawson levelled for Punjab as it ended 1-1 at ninety minutes.

Sam Bewick scored two penalties in Corinthian's 3-1 win at Meridian VP.

His first came in just the second minute, before Charlie Norcott's goal saw Valley Park level in the tenth.

Michael Hagan restored the Hoops' lead three minutes before the break and Bewick stepped up again to score in the 79th minute.

Faversham Town also progressed to the last eight as Stefan Payne's goal proved enough to progress with a 1-0 win Larkfield and New Hythe.

In the Premier Division, Hollands & Blair drew 1-1 at home to Lydd Town.

The goals were crammed in to a two minute spell with Dean Grant putting Lydd ahead in the 18th minute, only for Richard Atkins to level a minute later.

In Division One, AFC Whyteleafe moved seven points clear at the top last weekend after winning 2-1 at second placed Lewisham Borough.

James Teodorescu scored their 90th minute winner after Bryan Zepo had levelled for Borough in the 62nd.

Adam Allen had opened the scoring for the Leafe in the first half.

Rochester United's 8-0 win at K Sports kept them in third spot, while Larkfield and New Hythe slipped to a surprise 2-1 defeat at Canterbury City.

The Larks remain in the play-off places in fourth spot, while Staplehurst Monarchs are also in the play-off places after a 2-0 win here against SC Thamesmead.

Croydon lost ground on the play-off teams after a surprise 2-1 defeat at Meridian.

The Trams had led through James Ayetine, but two goals in the last five minutes of the first half from Zach Jacobowski and Christian Ibitoye turned the game around.

Faversham Strike Force produced a stunning second half performance to beat Greenways 5-1.

Jack Smith scored for the Force three minutes after the break before Jack Austin levelled in the 55th minute.

Tom Barton restored the lead in the 63rd minute and three goals in the last ten, from Tom Carter, Marshall Wratten and an own goal, complete the win.
