HISTORY - PEACEHAVEN & TELSCOMBE FC



Ithough officially the club was formed in 1923 as a result of a merger between Peacehaven Rangers and Telscombe Tye, it is recorded that a number of games were played in 1922 following a meeting of interested players in June of that year.

After the Second World War the club joined Junior Division One of the Brighton, Hove & District Football League for the start of the 1949–50 campaign finishing runners up at the first attempt.

Two seasons later the club achieved promotion to the Intermediate Division when they finished as champions of the Junior Division One, and gained further promotion the next season when they finished runners-up in the Intermediate Division.

However they could only survive two seasons in the Senior Division before being relegated back to the Intermediate Division at the end of the 1954–55 competition. Four seasons later the club bounced back up to the Senior Division, when they finished runners-up, but as before they could only survive two seasons in the top division before being relegated again.

The 1963–64 season saw the club promoted back to the Senior Division as champions of the Intermediate Division.

The club would then go on to win the Senior Division five seasons later, without losing a single game.

The Senior Division win in the Brighton

League enabled the club to be promoted to Division Two of the Sussex County Football League, for the start of the 1969–70 season.

Their fourth season in Division Two, the 1972–73 campaign, saw the club make their debut in the FA Cup, where they beat Burgess Hill Town in the first qualifying round before losing to Lewes in the next round.

The 1975–76 season saw the club gain promotion to Division One for the first time, when they finished runners up behind Selsey.

In their third season, 1978–79, in Division One the club finished as champions of the Sussex County League. The club went on to remain in Division One for another nineteen seasons during which time they went on to win the League title a further six times.

Two seasons after winning the last of these six titles, the 1997–98 campaign saw the club relegated to Division Two. The club bounced back as runners-up of Division Two, three seasons later but could only last two seasons back in Division One.

Two seasons after being relegated from Division One, the club was relegated to Division Three for the first time in their history.

The next season saw them become Champions of Division Three in the 2005–06 season, earning promotion back to Division Two.

The club was back in Division One three seasons later when, under manager Darren Guirey, they earned promotion as Champions of Division Two.

The club achieved further success at the end of the 2012–13 campaign the club won the Sussex County League for the eighth time in their history and earning themselves promotion to the Isthmian League.

In 2013–14, the club won the Isthmian League Division One South and earned a second successive promotion, reaching the Isthmian Premier Division.

Unfortunately the club finished 21st of 24 clubs and were relegated back to the

Isthmian Division One South.

Worse was to follow in 2015-16 as the club finished bottom of the league and suffered a second successive relegation. Back in what was now the Southern Combination League, Peacehaven finished fourteenth in 2016-17.

After finishing 7th and 10th in the following two seasons, both 2019-20 and 2020-21 were abandoned due to COVID.

The two seasons since the pandemic have seen two 8th places for the Tye.

The 2023-24 season sees the club looking to push on and hopefully at least make the play-offs.

SCEFL - ROUND UP



lebe lost their unbeaten home record last week, as Deal Town returned to form with a 3-1 win at Foxbury Avenue.

Aaron Millbank's penalty midway through the first half put Deal ahead before Rory Smith's second half double sealed the points.

Glebe pulled one back a minute from time.

Faversham Town took advantage of our lack of fixture to move second with an 8-0 hammering of Stansfeld.

Josh Vincent and Stefan Payne both scored in the first seven minutes, but the Lilywhites failed to add to their tally in the first half.

Matt Newman netted three minutes in to the second half but the floodgates opened after Sam Hasler's 64th minute strike.

Payne made it 5-0 from the spot five minutes later before Newman and Connor Essam scored in the following five minutes.

Jefferson Aibangbee iced the cake with goal number eight in the 82nd minute.

Whitstable Town could have moved into the play-off places, but instead dropped a place to seventh after late drama at Belmont Road.

After two defeats and a 0-9 aggregate in the previous week, Marcus Elliott put Welling Town ahead in the ninth minute.

Josh Williams levelled with a 54th minute penalty levelled for Whitstable, who looked to have taken all three points when Harvey Smith made it 2-1 in the 89th minute. Three minutes into added time Elliott levelled and Perez Goumou won it for the Boots in the 99th minute.

Lordswood have suffered fewer defeats than anyone this season in the League, and continued that form with a 1-0 win at home to Tunbridge Wells.

James Jeffrey continued his excellent form with the game's only goal.

The previous midweek saw both last season's League Cup finalists exit in the second round.

Hollands & Blair drew 3-3 at Kennington but went out 5-4 on penalties.

It was sweet revenge for Kennington who lost on penalties to the same opposition in last season's semi-finals.

Fisher also drew 3-3, at Holmesdale, but went out 4-2 from the spot.

Lewisham Borough caused an upset as they beat Welling Town 3-0 at Ladywell Arena.

Corinthian recovered from conceding early at Stansfeld to win 6-2 with Sam Bewick bagging a hat-trick, including two penalties.

Whitstable Town were twice behind at home to Lordswood before four goals in the last twenty minutes saw them win 5-2.

Haydon Velvick scored a hat-trick in the last seven minutes as Rusthall beat Forest Hill Park 4-0 at Jockey Farm.

Deal Town, Larkfield & New Hythe and Meridian VP also progressed to Round three, with the remaining ties due to be played earlier this week.


