WELCOME - KENNINGTON FC

G ood evening and welcome to the Stanmore Group Stadium as we return to League action, with the visit of Kennington.

A very warm welcome to everyone who has made the journey up from Ashford this evening and we hope you enjoy your stay.

We visited Homelands just seventeen days ago when we fought out a goalless draw. Both sides had chances to win the game and we expect tonight to be similarly competitive.

Dan Scorer's side had a hard start to the season, having to play all of their games away while a new 4G pitch was laid at Homelands.

That saw them at the foot of the table, but since being able to play at home they have climbed out of the relegation places, and should have enough quality to not worry about it.

Our last home game saw us make hard work of beating Welling Town 4-2. Having wasted chances early on we fell behind to a soft goal. Thankfully Ollie Milton levelled five minutes later, before James Dyer netted from the spot after he had been brought down in added time at the end of the first half. His second spot kick looked to have ended any doubts, only for us to concede again. Thankfully Jake Lovell followed up his first goal for the club against Glebe with another to finish the job.

Jake continued his good form with two more on Saturday as we again concede

first before winning 3-1 at Holmesdale in the League Cup quarter-finals. Despite going in a goal down, the signs were there at the end of the first half. James Dyer deserves credit for chasing a lost cause on the first goal, beating their keeper to a long kick from Mackenzie Foley to leave Jake with a tap in. Four minutes later Jake scored again and Ollie Milton made it three in seven minutes with a great reaction finish.

The team saw out the game with very little discomfort to set up a two legged semi-final with Deal Town. The other semi-final will be see Corinthian face AFC Whyteleafe who look to be running away with Division One.

The first leg will be at Deal next Tuesday, with the second leg here the following Tuesday.

Before then we face another semi-final when we play Larkfield & New Hythe Wanderers in the Kent Senior Trophy this Saturday.

While we will be favourites, they have a lot of experience in the squad, and won 9-0 at Greenways on Saturday.

As always you can help by coming down to support the team.

With the play-offs still a possibility it promises to be an exciting couple of months coming up.

HISTORY - KENNINGTON FC 🐺

The formation of Kennington Football Club dates back to before 1890. The Kent County Football Association records show their existence in 1888, however The Football Association puts their birth in 1885.

What is not in dispute was that Kennington Football Club was the oldest junior club in Kent.

Both the associations marked that fact and presented the club with illuminated addresses to mark the achievement in 1988.

Throughout most of the last century the club competed in the local Ashford and District League where the opposition was mainly drawn from village sides, together with a large number of military teams along with sides representing strong railway connections.

The advent of the company sponsored teams began to emerge around the seventies. The club has fixture cards and photographs dating back to the 1900's.

The club took the decision to step up the football pyramid into the prestigious Kent County League in the 1980's. This was an attempt to mix with stronger opposition, better playing conditions, and in turn, a higher standard of officialdom both on and off the pitch.

Kennington Football Club has a long established and well respected Junior Section from where many of today's squad began their playing careers. Their step up into the Southern Counties East Football League is the result of success in winning the Kent County Premier League in 2017/18.

Remarkably the club didn't draw a single game in that promotion season, winning 25 and losing three as they took the title 12 points clear of runnersup Greenways.

The club entered an exciting new phase of its history for the 2018/19 campaign, ground sharing at Ashford United's Homelands Stadium.

The team started the season with a 1-1 draw at Kent Football United, before their debut at Homelands saw them thrash Phoenix Reserves 5-1.

After winning nine of their eleven games in the New Year Dan Scorer's side finished a highly creditable third in their inaugural season at Step 6.

Kennington entered the FA Vase for the first time in 2019/20, making it through to the second round. Promotion beckoned once again as the side were top with six games remaining, prior to the season being abandoned due to the covid-19 outbreak.

An incredible start to 2020-21 saw the Ton win all six of their opening League fixtures with an aggregate of 27-3.

They also defeated SCEFL Premier Division sides Erith Town, Fisher (on penalties) and Glebe in the FA Vase as well as thrashing Southern Combination League side Shoreham 7-1. The Glebe game was Dan Scorer's 200th game in charge, taking Ton to the third round for the first time, prior to bowing out at home to Combined Counties outfit, Sutton Common Rovers.

Another first was achieved at the start of 2020/21, with Ton gaining entry into the FA Cup – narrowly defeated by a solitary goal to nil at home to Erith & Belvedere.

Sadly the season was scrapped as COVID reared it's ugly head again, but the club's rise continued at the end of 2020/21, achieving promotion to the SCEFL Premier Division by virtue of the FA's NLS restructuring at Steps 4-6. with promotion to the SCEFL Premier Division.

The club lost their opening fixture 3-2 at Punjab United but finished a highlyrespectable fifth in its debut season in the SCEFL Premier Division.

The club also reached the first qualifying round of the FA Cup, losing 3-0 at home to Isthmian Premier Division side, Carshalton Athletic after wins at home to Horley Town and Little Common.

It was 12th place for the Ton last season and they now go into 2023/24 eagerly awaiting the excitement ahead.

After their start to the previous season Kennington were rewarded

eal Town's FA Vase tie at Bridgwater United was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch on Saturday.

Thankfully the Somerset club got a decision before Deal travelled, and they will now play this Saturday.

Five Premier Division games survived the weather on Saturday, and remarkably four of them, plus our game at Holmesdale, ended 3-1 to the visitors.

Glebe went behind to Fin Dent's goal for Kennington before recovering to win, with Jason Barton, Jonathan Erharbor and Jamie Philpot finding the net.

Bearsted consolidated their play-off hopes with a late win at Corinthian.

Jack Palmby got the Bears off to a great start with a third minute goal, but Luke Adams' 54th minute effort looked to have secured Corinthian a point.

Step forward Will Johnson-Cole whose goals in the 89th and 90th minute secured the points for the visitors.

Punjab United did the hard part in the first half as Steve Ratcliff, Neil Spencer and Cruis Nyadzayo put them 3-0 up after 37 minutes at Hollands & Blair.

Richard Atkins pulled a goal back on the stroke of half-time from the

penalty spot, but there was to be no second half comeback.

Life gets no easier for Welling Town who went down 3-1 at home to Lordswood.

Victory would have taken the Boots out of the bottom two, but goals from Josh Reid and Callum Peck put paid to those hopes.

Ex-Docker Sam Bailey pulled one back before Artem Kuchkov restored the Lords' two goal lead in the last minute.

Reece Gillies' goal gave Whitstable Town a 1-0 win at VCD Athletic, who included former Dockers Ben Fitchett, Harry Lawrence and Steadman Callender in their squad.

Another former player, Helge Orome, scored twice in AFC Whyteleafe's 6-1 win at Faversham Strike Force in Division One.

The Leafe are nine points clear of second placed Staplehurst Monarchs who have a game in hand.

Larkfield & New Hythe put bottom side Greenways to the sword at K Sports, winning 9-0 with six different players finding the net.

Former Kennington player Mo Cham bagged a hat-trick for Canterbury City as they beat Meridian VP 3-2 at Hartsdown Park.




