WELCOME - FISHER FC

fter a successful start to our FA Vase campaign on Saturday we are back at the Stanmore Stadium this evening for SCEFL Premier Division action.

Our opponents this evening are Fisher Football Club and we welcome their players, officials and supporters.

We have already seen what they are capable of after losing 4-2 at St Paul's Stadium in October, and while we have home advantage tonight, it will be another tough game.

Fisher will also be our next home opponents when they visit for the Kent Senior Trophy in eleven days time.

Saturday saw us progress to the 3rd round of the FA Vase with a 2-0 win against Peacehaven & Telscombe.

James Dyer gave us the lead from the penalty spot, before Peacehaven were awarded a penalty just before half-time.

While it was hotly disputed, Player of the Match Jordan Olds came to our rescue with a superb save.

Harry Taylor came off the bench to add a second when he charged down their goalkeepers clearance which hit him and rolled over the line.

While the match wasn't a classic, we got the job done with a clean sheet and no bookings, so everybody went home happy.

The draw was made after this programme went to print, so please listen out this evening for news of the next round.

While they were disappointed to lose, we should mention the visiting supporters who seemed to enjoy their afternoon, and were still in good spirits when they left.

Congratulations also to the son of one of the visiting committee who passed his driving test on the day of the game.

After today we face two away games.

On Saturday we travel to League leaders Faversham Town. It will be a great test for the team, but at our best we can beat anyone in this League, so please get down to Salters Lane if you can to support the lads.

We follow that with a trip to Punjab United next Tuesday evening.

On the player front, Ronnie McClean has gone to Holmesdale to get some playing time under his belt.

After injury kept him out at the start of the season, Ronnie has had limited opportunities which he will hopefully get at Oakley Road.

Having come through the Academy, everyone thinks highly of Ronnie, who is a great lad and it would be good to see him come back better for the experience.

We've been drawn at home to Rusthall in the 3rd round of the SCEFL Challenge Cup. The tie will be played on Tuesday 5th December.

Hopefully we will see some of you at the two away games, or if not back here on Saturday week.

HISTORY - FISHER FC



riginally formed in 1908, the Fish have a chequered history, including the highs of taking on Bristol City in the 1st round of the FA Cup in 1984, playing Conference Football, and towards the end of Fisher Athletic, winning the London Senior Trophy.

The final few years of the old Fisher Athletic turned sour as the ground was lost and finally, in 2009 (five years after moving in with Dulwich Hamlet), the club was wound up by the high court.

A week later, following a successful meeting, a supporter's trust was set up to take control of the club.

Renamed Fisher FC and continuing to play at Dulwich's Champion Hill, the club entered the Kent League and finished their debut season in 13th under the guidance of Gary Lisney.

Various managers (including Billy Walton, Martin Ford and Steve Firkins) came and went in the following seasons, bringing varying levels of success to the club (most notably reaching the Semi-Finals of the Kent League Cup under Billy Walton in 2013-14, eventually losing 6-4 on aggregate to Beckenham, who went on to win the competition).

In December 2014, former Beckenham assistant manager Dean Harrison (the mastermind behind Becks' 2014 League Cup and Kent Senior Trophy double crown) took the reins.

He brought with him a host of new faces and achieved the main task of retaining SCEFL status with four games to spare, some impressive performances against more established sides turning more than a few heads along the way.

The club returned home to Rotherhithe just in time for the start of the 2016-17 season, with Gary Abbott taking over following Harrison's surprise departure in the summer.

Abbott struggled to get things going on the field and was relieved of managerial duties in November. The club moved quickly to bring Harrison back to the dugout for the survival fight.

Despite a valiant effort, the club were relegated to SCEFL Division 1, and finished third in 2017-18 season.

After finishing outside the promotion spots the club were awarded promotion by the FA Leagues Committee, and were back in the SCEFL Premier Division for the 2018-19 season.

A superb first season back at Step 5 saw the Fish finish 3rd in the league, having sat at the top of the tree mid-season. The club also reached the Semi-Final of the SCEFL Challenge Cup, and the Quarter Final of the Kent Senior Trophy.

Another shock departure from Harrison has seen the majority of that squad picked off to move on.

After a brief spell under the leadership of Allan Fenn at the beginning of the 2019/20 campaign, Ajay Ashanike took charge and steadied the ship before the Pandemic brought the season to a premature end.

A very short 2020/21 Season provided them with a run in the Emirates FA Cup that saw them beat Horsham YMCA, then Tooting & Mitcham via a dramatic tie settled on penalties to set up a trip to Cray Wanderers, which saw them lose 3-1.

With things finally back to normal, the 2021-22 Season saw them finish their SCEFL campaign in 13th place. While success didn't come on the pitch in the cups, they enjoyed a night to remember against Brentford's B team in the London Senior Cup. The Bees won 2-0 as Fisher set a new record home attendance of 425.

The 2022-23 Season brought much in the way of cup success, including a record breaking run in the Emirates FA Cup, reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round and taking National League South side Welling

United to a replay before bowing out in front of a record St Paul's crowd of 573.

A 59 game season was brought to a close with the Final of the SCEFL Challenge Cup, which saw them fall to a narrow defeat 2-1 against Hollands & Blair.

The 2023-24 Season brings fresh hope and several new faces as we look to build on last season's achievements under the guidance of Ajay Ashanike and his young coaching team.

SCEFL - ROUND UP



eal Town and Holmesdale joined us in the FA Vase 3rd round draw after victories on Saturday.

Deal won 4-1 away on the Sussex coast at Newhaven with Ben and Tom Chapman putting them 2-0 up at the break.

Rory Smith's two goals in the opening seven minutes of the second half put them out of sight before Callum Edwards grabbed a 74th minute consolation goal.

Manny Oshinowo got Holmesdale off to a flying start with a 3rd minute goal at home to Haywards Heath Town.

Callum Keeble added a second in the 16th minute with Sam Bayford completing a 3-1 win with a penalty on the hour, just four minutes after Hayden Skerry had pulled a goal back.

Glebe went out on penalties after drawing 2-2 at Burnham.

Jamie Philpot put Glebe ahead in the 3rd minute, before Burnham fought back to lead at the break.

Malachi Morris' 74th minute goal took the tie to a marathon penalty shoot out with the Buckinghamshire side winning 11-10.

Chris Edwards' penalty put Punjab United ahead in their tie at Roffey, but Shaun Findlay levelled three minutes later and Ricardo Fernandes' 90th minute penalty saw the hosts win 2-1.

Snodland Town must travel back to Farnham Town after Saturday's tie was abandoned less than twenty minutes after kick-off, when one of the assistant referees was injured. According to Farnham's 'X' account, a qualified official was found in the crowd who was prepared to take over but "it could not be agreed that they would be involved for whatever reason".

Tunbridge Wells bowed out on Sunday afternoon, losing 1-0 at Lingfield thanks to Richard Wetton's first half goal.

In the Premier Division, Faversham Town are back at the top after a 2-0 win at Welling Town.

Stefan Payne scored both goals for the visitors in the second half.

Lordswood have lost only once this season, fewer than any other team, but drew for the sixth time in eleven games at Sutton Athletic.

Quadri Green put the Lords ahead, but a Louie Lovell double sent Sutton in ahead at the break.

Freddie Oliver rescued a point for the visitors as he made it 2-2 in the 75th minute.

Whitstable Town moved into the play-off places with a 3-0 win at Rusthall.

Mikey Dalton's first half goal was followed by Josh Oliver and Josh Williams efforts in the second half.

Alfie Eldridge scored his first goal for Bearsted as they stayed in touch with the play-off pack after a 1-0 win at home to Hollands & Blair.

Kennington moved off of the bottom spot after drawing 2-2 at home to VCD Athletic.


