This is why we are the envy of a lot of other clubs at this level and always manage to achieve things even when people write us off.

The support you have given us not just this season, but for the past several years has got us to where we are, so we thank you for all that you do for us and the backing we receive. Let's stay realistic, positive, constructive and get behind Woody and the boys tonight.

HISTORY - HERNE BAY

Herne Bay were formed in 1886 and began life in the East Kent League, then having a short period in the Kent League before winning the East Kent League in four successive years between 1902 and 1906 returning to the Kent League as a result.

1953 saw the move to Winch's Field. Over 1,000 spectators saw their first match at their new home; a 2 - 2 draw against Tunbridge Wells Reserves in Kent League Division 2. Within two years they lifted the Division 2 title, winning promotion to Division 1. In the 1957/58 season the club won The Kent Amateur Cup beating Bromley 2 - 0 in the final. The following season saw the Kent League fold and a move to the Aetolian League followed. The 1964/65 season saw another move to Division 2 of the Athenian League, where they enjoyed several successful seasons followed by promotion to Division 1 on winning Division 2 in 1970/71. A good run in the FA Cup saw the Bay reach the 4th qualifying round, where they lost to the then 'mighty' Margate in front of a record home attendance of 2,303.

At the start of the 1974/75 campaign the Club returned to the Kent League, and in the 1978/79 season they had good runs in the Cup competitions, winning the Kent Senior Trophy and losing to Sheppey United in the final of the Kent League Cup. The nineties were the glory years which saw the Club become the most successful and consistent side in the Kent League, winning four Kent League titles. The 1996/97 season was without equal in the history of Herne Bay and the Kent League. Within the space of four weeks the Club won the Kent Senior Trophy, The Kent League Division 1 Cup and The Kent League Championship. A unique treble at the time!

A complete change of management and playing staff took place after the 1997/98 season, with manager Tommy Sampson leaving the Club to take over the reins at Deal Town taking the majority of the established first team players with him. Nick Denly (father of England cricketer Joe

Denly) received an unprecedented three manager of the month awards in his first full season at the helm.

A major grant was awarded to provide new perimeter fencing and refurbishment of the changing facilities and these works were complete prior to the start of the 2003/04 season when the club celebrated 50 years at Winch's Field. Jason Lillis took over the reins for the 2004/05 season which proved to be very successful as Bay finished runners up in both the League and League Cup. Both the 2005/06 and 2006/07 campaigns proved to be very disappointing with several senior players, and Lillis, leaving the Club during the 2007/08 season.

In came Barry Morgan and the Club turned to youth with the introduction of several very good young players into the squad who formed the basis of the first team for the 2008/09 season. There was a 6th place finish. The Club introduced some influential experienced players and had high hopes for a successful 2009/10 campaign. After some strange team selections Morgan left in October 2009, with assistant Simon Halsey taking over. Bay went on to finish as runners-up in the league and won the Kent League Premier Division League Cup. The following season there was another Kent League Premier Division League Cup win and Herne Bay missed out on the League title on goal difference in the last few minutes of the last match where an own goal at Tunbridge Wells gave Hythe Town the title.

In season 2011/12 Herne Bay swept all before them, narrowly missing out on a Wembley appearance in the FA Vase and capturing the Kent League Premier Division title and promotion to the Isthmian League. After struggling in the lower regions of Isthmian League Division One South for much of 2012/13 Halsey was relieved of his duties in April 2013.

The 2013/14 season saw another new start for

Herne Bay with Sam Denly (son of former manager Nick Denly) taking up the managerial reins. Denly held the post for four seasons and used many local players who had come through the town's youth systems. There were finishes of 18th, 9th 8th and 17th. Denly resigned at the end of the 2016/17 campaign and the majority of the squad moved on and the Club lost individuals who had over 2,500 appearances between them.

For 2017/18 Jermaine Darlington and John Embery were handed their first senior management roles, at Herne Bay, and had the basis of a young team which played exciting, flowing football that was well received but had a tendency to be inconsistent. After a mid-table finish in their first season things became more difficult the next year when money problems led to the loss of some key players. After being in the relegation zone early in the campaign things were being turned around when Darlington and Embery quit with Bay safe and six games of the season remaining.

By this time, it was a struggle money-wise and some of the older directors offered to stand aside if suitable replacements could be found. This opened the door for a consortium to come in led by rookie-Chairman Stuart Fitchie who was surrounded by fellow Directors who had many years' experience of running a football club. He had appointed Ben Smith, who had led Canterbury City to mid-table finishes in the Kent

League for the past four seasons, as manager. 2019/20 was terminated by Covid-19, with Bay in the final play-off position, and the following season was too ended by Covid, after just six league matches with Herne Bay in 10th place.

At the beginning of April 2022 Herne Bay were out of the play-off places but then a run of four victories and with fellow play-off contenders falling short Bay ended in third place and went on to win the play-offs and gain promotion to the Isthmian Premier.

13 league matches into the 2022/23 season, with the team one place off the bottom and five points from safety, after eight points from a possible 39, having chopped and changed the team, using 26 different players, and losing to the only team below, Ben Smith resigned. By the time that ex-Cray Valley PM manager Kevin Watson came in it was too late to stop the rot and Herne Bay's brief flirtation with the Isthmian Premier was over. Fitchie had rarely consulted his more knowledgeable colleagues and whilst a new 3G pitch was laid many other ground improvements remained incomplete.

Chairman Stuart Fitchie left the club in March 2023, A new chairman, Matt Barman, and additions to the board were introduced at the end of the 23/24 season and they will now be taking the club forward, adding a new post 16 academy in partnership with Herne Bay High School to run from the 24/25 season.

ISTHMIAN ROUND-UP



The Isthmian League South East saw a full programme of games this weekend so let's get straight into it.

Starting off at Homelands Stadium where a crowd of 446 watched **Ashford United** triumph over **Burgess Hill Town** with a 2-1 win, but it was the visitors who went ahead first on the 36th minute courtesy of **Dan Perry** before Ashford's **Gary Lockyer** evened things up right on the break. **Michael West** made sure of the win on 63' sending the Hillians home empty handed.

Beckenham Town continued their march towards the play-off places with a one nil win over **Sheppey United**. They left it till the 73rd minute before, as usual, **Louie Theophanous** grabbed the points sending the 248 in attendance at Eden Park Avenue home happy.

Tonight's opponents **Herne Bay** played tit-for-tat with **AFC Croydon Athletic** at The Crest Stadium in a match that ended up honours even at 2-2. **Kane Rowland** put the home side ahead on 9' but **Daniel Thompson** equalised on 25'. Five minutes into the second half the crowd of 476 saw **Michael Salako** put The Bay ahead again on 50' only for **Ibby Akanbi** to draw The Rams level on 69'.

Meanwhile, along the coast **Hythe Town** were playing out the same game with **Deal Town** at Reachfields in front of 395. **Anthony Adesite** slotted on 11' to put Hythe ahead and **Lex Allan** doubled their lead on 24', but **Tom Chapman** got Deal back into the game on 60' and an **unknown hero** levelled things to share the spoils.

Littlehampton Town didn't help themselves in their fight to avoid the drop by shipping four at home to **Sevenoaks Town**. A crowd of 247 at The Sportsfield could only be impressed at **Warren-Hughes Mfula** as he hit all four for The Oaks, first on 9' then on 32', completing his hat-trick on 58' and finishing with a penalty on 72'.

Another draw on the coast saw 451 watch **Margate** finish 1-1 with **Broadbridge Heath**

at Hartsdown Park. The Bears' **Sean Terry** gave them an early lead on 7' but **Tushaun Walters** brought The Gate level on 52' and that's how it stayed.

The Hybrid Fitness Stadium played host to a 445-strong crowd as **Merstham** continued to cement their play-off spot with a 3-0 drubbing of relegation candidates **Lancing**. All three goals came in the first half, another poor day being clearly signalled when **Emmanuel Robe** put the home side ahead after just 3'. **Charlie Greenwood** got the second from the spot on 23' and **Finlay Johnson** ensured an easy second half for The Moatsiders with the finishing touch on 37'.

Ramsgate's relentless top-of-the-table dominance continues apace, putting four past **Eastbourne Town** for no reply. An archetypal game of two halves at Southwood Stadium meant 1,421 saw the two teams go into the break 0-0, but second half **Alfie Paxman** opened Ramsgate's account on 49' and a quickfire double from **Joe Taylor** on 63' and **Tom Clifford** on 67' made the result certain before a final flourish from **Joe Taylor** on 85' put the game out of site.


Phoenix Sports' late push to avoid relegation got another boost at The Shooting Field where 115 saw a narrow 1-0 win over fellow strugglers, **Steyning Town Community**. **Perri landolo** secured the points for the visitors in the 29th minute but the big talking point seems to be a flurry of red cards on 90+2' which saw the two teams end 9 vs 10.

Finally, at their Jubilee Field home, 231 saw a late, late penalty give **Three Bridges** three goals and three points by beating **Sittingbourne** 3-2. The Bricks were first on the board from a **Liam Smith** strike on 22 minutes before **Noel Leighton** equalised for The Bridges on 37'. **Ryan Kingsford** put the visitors ahead on 52' but Leighton got his brace a minute later to even the score. But it was **Ben Holden** stepping up to take the last gasp penalty on 90+1' that gets the plaudits.
