HISTORY - EASTBOURNE TOWN



Eastbourne Town Football Club, founded on 19 October 1881 as Devonshire Park F.C., holds the distinction of being Sussex's oldest senior football club. The club's first ground was Devonshire Park, a venue now known for hosting a major pre-Wimbledon tennis tournament. The football club played there until 1886, when tennis became the dominant sport at the park, leading to the football team's relocation to the nearby Saffrons Field. This move marked the beginning of a long association with the Saffrons, where the club still plays today. The field is named after the saffron crocus, which had been cultivated on the site for medicinal purposes.

In 1889, the club was renamed Eastbourne FC. Known for its 'gentlemen amateurs,' Eastbourne soon became a force in Sussex football, winning the Sussex Senior Cup eight times in the first 15 years of its existence. This era cemented the club's reputation as a major player in county football. The early 1900s saw further successes, including the club's first international trophy in 1904, when Eastbourne won the Paris New Years Tournament. This victory highlighted the club's growing stature beyond local competitions.

The club joined the South Eastern League in 1905, playing against reserve teams from big clubs like Arsenal, Chelsea, and Tottenham Hotspur. Despite struggling in the first season, which resulted in relegation, Eastbourne continued to build its profile. In 1907, the club aligned with the Amateur Football Alliance and became a founding member

of the Southern Amateur League, where it remained until after World War II. Another international triumph came in 1909 when the club won the "Challenge International du Nord," a competition that included amateur teams from France, Belgium, and other European countries.

The 1920s were a golden era for Eastbourne Town, with two league championships and two national AFA Senior Cup victories. The club also made multiple appearances in the Sussex Senior Cup finals, winning several titles during this period. By the 1930s, the club had become a fixture of Sussex football, with large crowds regularly attending matches at the Saffrons. Improvements to the ground included the construction of a wooden grandstand and terracing on the popular Town Hall side.

During World War II, the Saffrons survived intact, and friendly matches were frequently played there. Post-war, Eastbourne Town joined the Corinthian League and later moved into the Athenian League following a merger in 1963. The immediate post-war years saw attendances peak at an average of 3,000, with a record crowd of 7,378 attending an FA Cup tie against Hastings United in 1953. The club also enjoyed further successes in the Sussex Senior Cup and RUR Charity Cup.

In 1971, after being known as "Town Club" for over 80 years, the club adopted its current name, Eastbourne Town FC. Unfortunately, the club's fortunes began to wane in the 1970s, and by 1976, declining attendances led to their resignation from the Athenian League.

However, upon joining the Sussex County League, Eastbourne immediately lifted the championship and reached the Sussex Senior Cup final in their first season.

The 1990s saw the installation of floodlights at the Saffrons, which helped the club stage a resurgence. Despite some setbacks, including relegation in 2001, Eastbourne returned to form, achieving promotion in 2003. In 2007, the club secured the Sussex County League Championship and was promoted to the Isthmian League. This period was notable for the club's efforts to improve the Saffrons, culminating in FA Community Club status.

Despite a reprieve from relegation in 2010 and an 11th-place finish in 2013, the club couldn't avoid the drop in 2014, returning to the County League. However, Eastbourne Town remained competitive, finishing fourth in 2014-2015 and winning the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the sixth time. More recent years saw steady improvement in the Sussex County League, including a strong performance in the 2019 Sussex

Senior Cup, where they reached the quarter-finals before losing to Brighton & Hove Albion's under-23 team.

In 2022, Eastbourne Town appointed Dave Shearing as Chairman who immediately established a five year plan to take the club to the next level. A change of management saw John Lambert stepping down after 8 years and being replaced by former Whitehawk manager, Jude Macdonald. The club also recruited new officials to the committee with fresh, forward thinking and innovative ideas. This combination of experience and youth on and off the pitch would play a significant role in early success.

Under Macdonald's guidance, Eastbourne Town finished second in the 2023-24 season, securing a place in the first-ever Southern Combination League play-offs. Victories over Hassocks in the semi-final and Newhaven in the final saw Eastbourne Town promoted back to the Isthmian League after a 10-year absence, marking a triumphant return to higher-level football for the club.

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The Non-League Paper Column By Jon Couch

STEP 3 clubs enter the Isuzu FA Trophy at this third qualifying round stage this weekend – and already the Road to Wembley is shaping up into another thrilling adventure.

They join the 40 clubs from Step 4 to progress from the previous round to make up 64 intriguing ties, starting with Bradford Park Avenue versus Heaton Stannington and Worcester City against Rugby Town on Friday night.

As compiled by our friends at Non-League Facfile, two-time winners Grays Athletic are the last ones standing of the 32 clubs that started this season's campaign in the preliminary round.

The 2004-05 and 2005-06 winners visit Hanwell Town and are one of four former winners competing in this round alongside Canvey Island (2000-01), Bishop's Cleeve (1980-81) and Hednesford Town (2003-04).

Indeed, Hednesford, flying high in Northern Premier League Premier division under manager Gavin Hurren, are involved in one of the ties of the round when they go to Southern League Premier Central leaders Harborough Town.

At the other end of the FA Trophy experience spectrum are seven debut clubs still involved, namely Lower Breck, Silsden, Shifnal Town, Sporting Club Inkberrow, Stanway Rovers, Hartpury and AFC Portchester – all bar one of which take on Step 3 opposition.

Hartpury have been handed a dream tie against high-flying Southern Premier South neighbours Gloucester City, similarly AFC Portchester, who can expect a big crowd at the Wicor Recreation Ground when Taunton Town visit.

Silsden and Sporting Club Inkberrow are at home, at Stocksbridge Park Steels and Stratford Town respectively, while Lower Breck and Shifnal Town face tough trips to Stockton Town and Gainsborough Trinity.

Stanway Rovers are the only debut club to face Step 4 opposition when Uxbridge make the trip to Hawthorns.

Derby days are also aplenty this weekend with Suffolk pair AFC Sudbury and Bury Town locking horns, while Bracknell Town and Hungerford Town will be vying for Berkshire honours. Local bragging rights are at stake also for Waltham Abbey v Walthamstow.

Elsewhere, there are 25 other clubs for whom victory would either equal or set a best FA Trophy run. However, only AFC Rushden and Diamonds versus Malvern Town and Ashford United v Biggleswade FC will guarantee that outcome. Those two ties are two of five that guarantee a Step 4 club will be in the first round.

St Ives Town versus Kettering Town is the most common tie of the round with St Ives ahead by two wins to one in past Trophy games. Meanwhile, Ashton United knocked out Clitheroe in both their previous Trophy matches separated by exactly 50 years in 1970 and 2020.

St Albans City and Bideford FC have had to wait 43 and 47 years respectively for the chance to avenge past Trophy defeats by Aveley and Dorchester Town, whilst the 7-2 win for Barwell over Bromsgrove Sporting the last time they met in the Trophy is the two clubs' respective biggest win and heaviest defeat in the competition.

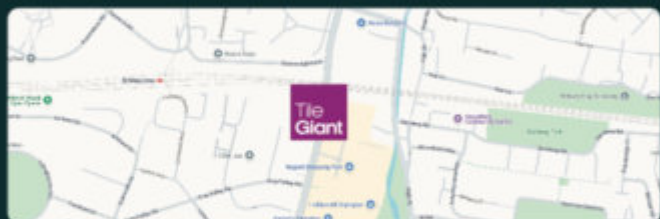
A Step 3 side has won the FA Trophy as recently as Hornchurch in the Covid year of 2020-21 – and that will give lower league clubs hope that the Road to Wembley is very much open to all.

Step 2 Spennymoor Town made it all the way to Non-League Finals Day just five months ago, giving their fans a day out they will never forget. Dreams do come true.

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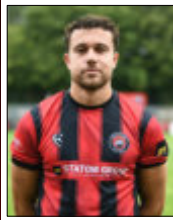

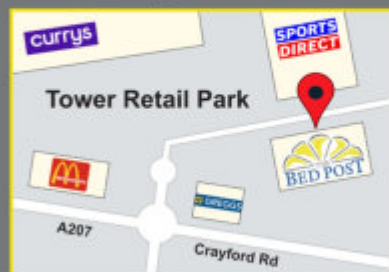
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PATHWAYS
