HISTORY - HANWELL TOWN

Overview

The history of Hanwell Town needs to be understood in three distinct but nevertheless linked phases. The first was the original foundation of the Club as Hanwell FC which lasted from 1884-1912. The second was the re-founding and renaming of the Club as Hanwell Town in 1920, a short period which lasted seven years before the Club folded for a second time. Finally, the third phase of the Club's history was the re-establishment of Hanwell Town in 1947.

The first phase

In 1884 four young men: J.D. Brayne, J.R. Mathias, John Wark and Charles Richins founded Hanwell Football Club playing at Church Fields at a rent of £4 per year and using the Viaduct pub as its club house. The Club continued to grow and by 1892 was running three teams. In 1893, it moved its headquarters to the Royal Victoria pub. In 1897, the Club won its first trophy, the West Middlesex Cup, sensationally defeating Brentford 1-0 and in 1898 joined the London League.

Unfortunately, the Club led a hand to mouth existence. The reason for the Club's financial predicament went back to 1898 when it joined the London League which had begun two years earlier. The cost of travel proved prohibitive and the Club took what proved to be an ill-fated decision to resign from the league at the end of the season and join the newly created and local Middlesex League for season 1899-1900. The folly of that decision quickly became evident as that league lasted for only one year before disbanding.

Committee dithering meant that although the Club decided to re-apply for admission to the London league it missed the date for applications

and was forced to play friendly fixtures. Indeed, it was to be two more years before it successfully re-joined the London League playing for three seasons from 1902-1905 when the Club joined the Great Western Suburban League. In 1908, Hanwell reached the final of the Middlesex Senior Cup but lost the final to Southall 1-0.

Despite being moderately successful and holding its own in the leagues, the Club's best achievement was its solitary Middlesex Cup final appearance. Caught in a footballing triangle of three local well-established and successful clubs (Brentford, Ealing and Southall) it failed to make a significant impact and attendances remained stubbornly low. The Club struggled on but beset by small crowds and high ground rents was always in a financially precarious position and in 1912 it folded.

The second phase

In 1920 the Club was reformed, this time taking the name of Hanwell Town. Local folklore and tradition maintain that it was founded by Geordies, many of whom were demobbed servicemen after the Great War. Many of them worked on major projects such as Sir Robert McAlpine's construction company building the Great Western Water Treatment works pipeline from Hammersmith to Isleworth. Unfortunately, the names of these playing pioneers have been lost as there are no surviving official club records from this period.

It was around this time that the Club began to play in the famous black and white stripes of Newcastle United. Once again, financial pressures and low attendances meant that the club was always operating on a shoestring and in 1927 it folded once again. Nevertheless, the link with West London was maintained and in the 1930s the Walker family from Gateshead was

one of hundreds who came down from the Northeast to London in the 1936 depression looking for work. It was to be the family's eldest son Ron who went on to re-establish the Geordie heritage and transform the fortunes of the Club.

The third phase

During the Second World War, Walker served in the RAF. After demobilisation he joined Hanwell Town Sports & Social Club in 1948 and played for the first XI with his two brothers Raynor and Albert. It was the start of a 60 year love affair with the Club. Initially, the Club played in the Dauntless league. From 1949-1969 it played in the Harrow and District League. In 1969 the Club won election to the Middlesex League and played there until 1983 when it joined the London League playing there until 1987 when it joined the Spartan League.

The Club joined the Isthmian League in 2018 then in 2021 it won election to the Southern League Premier Division (South) which is Level 7 / Step 3 in the football pyramid. This is the highest standard of football that the club has ever achieved in its history.

Club honours include: Spartan League Champions 1983-4, London Senior Cup

Winners 1992-3 and again in 1993-4, Premier Division Cup Winners 2002-03, Premier Division Champions 2013-14, and most recently Middlesex Senior Cup Winners 2020-21.

No account of the history of the club would be complete without paying tribute to four other men who have been prominent in the history of the club:

- Bob Fisher the Club Chairman who has been involved with the club since 1955 and has been first XI captain, manager, Treasurer, Chairman and President in his long career;
- Phil Player who holds the record number of first XI appearances;
- Ray Duffy who as player and manager amassed 997 first XI games; and
- Dave Iddiols the current President who has been with the club for nearly 50 years.

With such a strong commitment to the local community, a first-class ground, a youth section that has over thirty teams and an ever increasing and fiercely loyal supporter base, the future of the Club is brighter than ever.

NON-LEAGUE football is the pillar of our communities and the true heartbeat of the game – there really is so much to be proud of. But, whether we like it or not, it is also a giant mirror of our society and one that acts with anger and little fear of consequence.

Football brings out the best of us and we shouldn't forget that. The hours and hours of dedication people put in, more often than not unpaid, simply for their love of their club or just the game itself. But, here we are in 2026 and the same old problems continue to plague us. Racism, sadly, is still very much alive and kicking.

Over the years, The NLP have reported on countless stories of discriminatory abuse levelled at players, officials and fellow supporters, and once again last week, we followed up a statement issued by a club in support of one of their own.

It came after Jermaine Francis posted a screenshot on X of the racist abuse he was sent on Snapchat after joining Sutton United. The 23-year-old winger, who made the switch from Hartlepool United, said it was the second message he'd had received.

"We regret to report that we have been made aware of racist abuse directed towards Jermaine Francis on social media," Sutton said.

"Following the completion of his transfer from Hartlepool United to Sutton United yesterday afternoon, Jermaine received a message on his Snapchat account that included racial abuse.

"As a club we condemn racism and discrimination in all forms, in the strongest possible manner. This behaviour has no place in football, or in society, and we are angered that Jermaine has been subjected to such disgusting abuse.

"We can't wait to welcome Jermaine to the VBS Community Stadium and we know our superb supporters will be fully behind him, as well as the whole team, as they have been throughout the season.

"We stand with Jermaine and all victims of online discriminatory abuse.

Kick It Out campaigns to make sure football is always welcoming to everyone, and they're here to put an end to

every form of discrimination; something which we reiterate. There is no place for discrimination in football – or anywhere."

At the same time, we were also contacted by a Hereford supporter who was left shaken by a chant from his fellow supporters when they took on Merthyr Town in National League North recently. Karan Rai has supported the Bulls for 21 years, chairs the London Bulls Supporters' Club and, after agonising over whether to do so, penned a must-read open letter on Substack of how he felt that December afternoon and the impact it had.

"As an Asian Hereford fan, and as a proud Punjabi Sikh, I could not believe that after 21 years of following the club I love," he said.

"I witnessed a group of Hereford supporters singing 'I'd rather be a P*ki than a Taff' loudly and repeatedly before kick-off at the Merthyr game, behind the goal," he wrote. "A game I was really looking forward to with my friends was totally ruined in seconds.

"Let me tell you, having a load of people sing that chant behind you when you're one of very few ethnic minorities in the ground is not a nice experience.

"What made it even more baffling and painful was recognising people I know among those singing it. Some of the same people who, only months earlier against Worksop, would have held up a 'Give Racism the Red Card' placard. How do you make sense of that one?"

Making sense of it feels impossible. There has never been a time with less of an excuse for not understanding the power of words. Hereford should be applauded for their statement on the matter, which is now a police investigation. Rai wants his story to become a positive too.

"It has been met with an outpouring of support and I ultimately want the letter to be an educational tool for good," he said. "I want to turn this situation into a positive and for some good to come out of it. I want this letter to encourage people to stand up to racism in football and to stop it's normalisation and to call it out. I want people to feel encouraged that they can step forward too."

It's that attitude that should empower us all to rid society of this disease in 2026 and beyond.

When things were looking strong for the youthful Erith side, Meridian's number 9 hits a beautiful strike from 20 yards out into the top left corner, no chance for Woody Leach in the Erith net.

With being a goal down so early on after having the better start, Erith knew they had to get back into this game as quick as possible. And just a minute after going a goal down, Casey Hewitt got the Dockers level. The ball was played into the striker, with his back to goal but a nice swivel to get past the Meridian defender left a chance for Hewitt to take, which he did firing his shot into the near right corner past the helpless Meridian keeper.

The Dockers, now back in the game, controlled the tempo well starting from captain Finley Bowden and the game was finally back on Erith terms, chances did come

for several Dockers players but were not taken with the game still level at half time.

Going into the second half both teams started to open up after a tight first half, this benefited the home side as more gaps opened up for the Dockers and they took the lead for the first time in the game through captain Finley Bowden. Just after the hour mark substitute Jonas made a superb run down the left hand side, after beating his marker with trickery he pulled the ball back to the on running skipper who placed it past the keeper to put Erith ahead for the first time in the game.

After a change of formation to a 3-5-2, the Dockers attack seemed to be wanting more goals to wrap up the game. A big chance fell to substitute Frankie Driscoll, after Hewitt squared the ball past the keeper to a wide open Driscoll who saw the open net gleaming but his strike went over the bar.

With just minutes left, the young Dockers wrapped up the game with left back Reuben Lammie. The full back made a darting run down the flank, who got a yard away from his opposition number to get it onto his favoured left foot, to smash home in the far corner to make sure Erith took all three points.

A very strong defensive display helped the Dockers secure the win, only limiting the away side to one shot all game, with a quiet afternoon for keeper Woody Leach. A strong all round performance from each individual and much hope going forward for another unbeaten run.

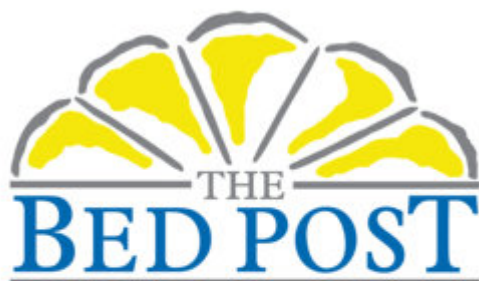

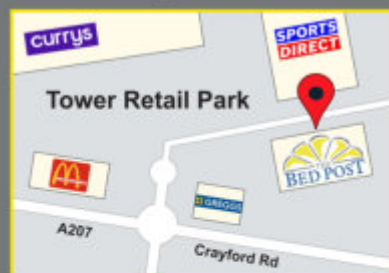
