HISTORY - SHEPPEY UNITED



Sheppey United FC was founded in 1890 following a merger between Sheerness Victoria and Invicta, playing their first match on September 20, 1890, against Sittingbourne. A match report dubbed the team "The Sheppeytes," inspiring the club's nickname, "The Ites", which remains today.

Sheppey United quickly became pioneers in football, founding members of both the Southern League and the Kent League in 1894. Their early years saw promotion battles, FA Cup appearances, and multiple Kent League titles, with the first-team and reserves dominating the league in the early 20th century.

Through the years, Sheppey United navigated various competitions, including the Aetolian League, Greater London League, and Metropolitan League, before rejoining the Kent League in 1972. The club enjoyed considerable success, securing multiple league championships and cup victories.

However, the late 1980s and early 1990s saw the club struggle financially, and despite winning the 1994–95 Kent League title, the sale of Botany Road in 1992 marked the beginning of a difficult period.

The sale of Botany Road led to a period of instability. The club initially continued its success, winning the Kent League title while ground-sharing at Faversham Town. However, the lack of a permanent home forced the club into a nomadic existence, moving from Faversham to Canterbury, then to Sittingbourne.

Attendance dwindled as fans grew disenchanted with travelling off the

island for "home" games. Financial difficulties mounted, and in March 2001, Sheppey United resigned from the Kent League, resulting in the club folding at senior level.

A revival attempt came in 2003, with the club re-entering football as AFC Sheppey, competing in the Kent County League. A promotion in their first season signalled hope, but challenges remained. The club briefly adopted the AFC Sheppey name in 2007 before reverting to its original identity in 2010.

In 2013, Sheppey United merged with Sheerness East FC to form Sheppey & Sheerness United FC, competing in the Kent County League Premier Division. The club relocated to Holm Park, a ground that would soon undergo major investment and redevelopment.

A successful 2013/14 campaign saw the club finish runners-up in the league and lift the Kent FA Intermediate Challenge Shield. By 2014, the club proudly restored its original name: Sheppey United FC.

Holm Park was transformed with a new clubhouse, floodlights, levelled pitches, and new dressing rooms. On the pitch, the club thrived, finishing second in the Kent Invicta League in 2015/16, securing promotion to the Southern Counties East Football League Premier Division.

The 2016 season was historic, with Sheppey United lifting the Kent Senior Trophy, defeating Ashford United in a dramatic penalty shootout final in front of 870 fans at Maidstone United's Gallagher Stadium. Meanwhile, Holm Park's revival was showcased when 715 supporters attended a home game against Glebe.

In the 2017-18 Season the team finished in a disappointing 11th place in the SCEFL Premier Division but did reach the Kent Senior Trophy Final again at The Gallagher in front of 917 spectators eventually losing 2-1 in Extra time to newly promoted Whitstable Town.

The 2018-19 Season saw an improvement on the previous season with an eventual 7th place finish in the Premier Division but the points were mainly gained before Christmas and the 2019 form was very inconsistent.

The club went into the 2019/20 season with high hopes as many new, experienced players were added to the squad, and by 14 March 2020 the team had certainly not disappointed. Unbeaten in the whole of 2020 with only nine league games remaining they were one of four clubs fighting for promotion, and having already played every team in the top half of the table, on paper at least, had by far the easiest run-in. They had also fought their way to the final of the Kent Senior Trophy. Things were looking very bright at Holm Park...but COVID 19 curtailed the season making all results null and void.

The 2020/21 began on 1st September but, once again, the leagues were postponed because of a re-emergence of the virus.

The 2021/22 season was one we will never forget, winning a never to be equalled four trophies. The Kent FA finally arranged the postponed 2019/20 Kent Senior Trophy final for 1st February where we would face Corinthians who now played at Step 4 in the Isthmian League. We won the match 3-1 to lift the cup for the second time in 5 years. In April we competed for the 2021/22 Kent Senior Trophy Final at the Gallagher against Hollands & Blair and won a tight match 2-1 to lift the same trophy twice in the same season. The SCEFL Premier Division title was finally sealed on the final day of the season 23rd April with a points tally of 102 compared to Runners Up Chatham Town with 100. Then in May we would face Crowborough Athletic in the SCEFL League Cup and won 5-1.

On winning promotion to the Step 4 Isthmian League, the Isle of Sheppey welcomed a level of football in the National Non-League System unseen for thirty-two years.

Is there any better weekend in the English football calendar than the FA Cup first round proper?

We've long felt this is where we see the true heartbeat of English football – even through the qualifying rounds there are clubs living out their FA Cup dreams.

But the anticipation certainly builds as the proper stage of the competition approaches.

This weekend, 64 clubs take to the pitch hoping they can be one of the 32 Non-League names in the big draw televised on Monday night.

Dreaming they can get the plum tie that catapults them into the spotlight and, potentially, changes the course of their future.

We know there will be at least one Step 4 side in the famous velvet bag with Isthmian North title hopefuls Maldon & Tiptree welcoming Flackwell Heath, of Southern League Division One Central.

The hosts have a manager in Kevin Horlock who knows all about the big moments in football. He, of course, scored for Manchester City in that famous comeback play-off final win over Gillingham at Wembley in 1999.

And in their squad they boast former Premier League players like Freddie Sears and Gary Hooper, who even scored for Celtic against Barcelona.

Horlock freely admits the pressure is on when it comes to delivering promotion this season for their ambitious owners, but a big FA Cup run would be an added bonus.

Not that he's getting carried away with Flackwell Heath showing what they're all about in their 3-0 win at Step 3 Bracknell Town to get to this stage.

Two of their goalscorers that night – Jamie and Matthew Ayres – are the sons of manager Chris! How's that for an FA Cup fairytale if they could make it through to the first round proper?

Chris will be tuning in from holiday this week, however, with a long-booked trip of a lifetime to South Africa!

Runcorn Linnets are the other Step 4 side dreaming of glory. They upset Ashton United in the FA Cup third round qualifying and will need to overturn the odds again when they host National League North Buxton.

But the lowest-ranked side left in the competition are from Step 5 – and a team already familiar with the national stage following last season's FA Vase triumph.

Whitstable Town have knocked out three Step 3 sides – Dulwich Hamlet, Chichester City and Hungerford Town – to set up their away trip to Wealdstone.

It's already the club's best FA Cup run and manager Jamie Coyle has been putting in the hours with his management staff to do their homework on the National League Stones.

A quirk of how the fourth round qualifying regions had to be split ahead of the third round qualifying replays means Billericay Town are making the long trip to Spennymoor Town on Saturday, while Gateshead are heading in the other direction to Aveley!

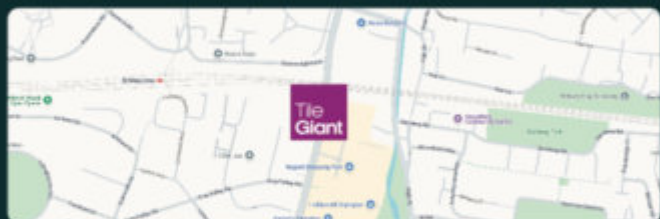
And how about up-and-coming Farnham Town hosting one of the biggest games in their club's history when Sutton United are in town.

Sutton know all about causing an upset to create FA Cup history. Their motivation, as for many of the National League clubs this time out, is not to be on the other end this year!

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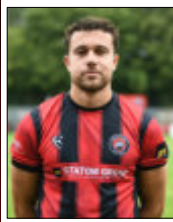

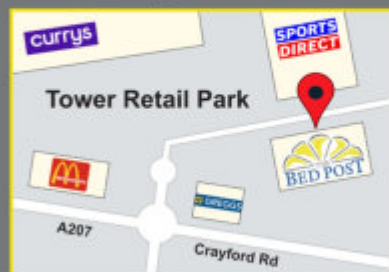
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the wing and crossing it in for a goal. He is also often on the end of the goal scoring.
