HISTORY - HASSOCKS FC



Hassocks Football Club was founded in 1902 and spent the first 80 years of its existence competing in the Mid Sussex Football League and Brighton and Hove and District Football League, playing at Adastra Park in the middle of the village.

The Robins first piece of silverware came when lifting the Mid Sussex League's prestigious Mowatt Cup in 1928. In 1960, they added the showpiece trophy of the Montgomery Cup to their honours list.

It was a move to the Brighton & Hove League in the mid 1960s that really started to get Hassocks noticed. The Robins won promotion from Division Three to Division One in back-to-back seasons in 1965 and 1966, lifting the Brighton League title in 1972 after finishing runners up the previous year.

The Sussex Intermediate Cup was added in 1975 to complete a golden era for Hassocks. Ambitions of senior football were finally realised for 1981-82 when the club became members of Division One of the Southern Combination Football League.

They finished that first season in 12th place and consolidated their hard earned senior status with a succession of top half placings in the division, until a change in ground grading rules saw them demoted into Division Two and a return to intermediate football.

After several seasons of treading water, 1991 saw huge changes. Former player and manager Jim Goodrum took over as chairman, Dave John arrived as general manager from Haywards Heath Town and a new coaching team of Nick Greenwood and Peter Liddell took over first team affairs.

John, Greenwood and Liddell between them coaxed a mass influx of new players. Results were immediate as Greenwood and Liddell led Hassocks to the Division Two title by 10 points in their first season at the helm.

Three years later and Greenwood and Liddell took Hassocks into the Premier

Division of the Southern Combination League for the first time, winning promotion as Division One runners up.

The 1995-96 season saw Hassocks make their debut in the FA Vase. A year later and the Robins entered the FA Cup. Their best run in the world's greatest cup competition came under the management of John, who led Hassocks all the way to the third qualifying round in 2001-02.

2002 saw Hassocks mark their centenary by facing an ex-Arsenal and Celebrity XI. Later in the year and Steve Coppell took charge of Brighton and Hove Albion for the first time when the Seagulls visited the Beacon to open the new 237-seater Maurice Boxall Stand, funded in part by the previous season's FA Cup run.

The 2011-12 season saw Mickey Jewell lead Hassocks to what as then their highest ever finish of fourth in the Premier Division. A memorable campaign also saw the Robins reach the semi final of the RUR Cup.

Jewell stepped down at the end of the 2013-14 season, replaced by club legend John returning for a brief third spell at the helm alongside his duties as chairman. John was followed by Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar, who produced a great escape from relegation in the second half of the 2014-15 season.

Dalgleish and Wickwar continued to do well under difficult circumstances, defying the odds to avoid the drop despite being one of the only sides in the Premier Division not to pay their players.

The Robins' proud run of never finishing in the bottom three of the top flight came to an end at the conclusion of the 2017-18 season, although they were spared relegation as only two sides went down.

Wickwar stood down at the end of the campaign, leaving Dalgleish in sole charge for 2018-19. Hassocks were in the Premier Division's bottom two when Covid-19 brought the 2019-20 season to a premature end, leading to Dalgleish's departure after a decade at the Beacon.

John was back in charge for the 2020-21 season which again was curtailed due to the pandemic. John moved upstairs to become technical director ahead of the 2021-22 campaign, with Brad Sweetman stepping up to become first team head coach from his role as Under 18s manager.

Sweetman had been part of John's management team that led the Under 18s to an historic treble in 2017-18, following that up with a succession of runners up finishes when left in sole charge of the Young Robins. Now, he and the players he had brought through the youth system and into the first team over the past five seasons had the opportunity to prove themselves at senior level. Hassocks ended the campaign in 16th spot and reached the semi finals of the RUR Cup for the first time in a decade.

Sweetman was replaced at the end of the season by fan favourite player James Westlake. His rebuilt squad made up of new faces and former favourites lured back to the Beacon finished 10th in 2022-23, securing the club's first top half placing in nine years.

Better was to come in 2023-24. Hassocks acquired a club-record 78 points to finish fifth in the table, qualifying for the promotion playoffs for the first time. The Robins were eliminated by eventual winners Eastbourne Town.

John retired as chairman in the summer of 2024, ending over 33 years of day-to-day involvement in running the Robins. His final gift was the appointment of his successor. The second-highest goal scorer for Hassocks, Pat Harding, stepped straight from retirement as a player into the role of chairman, bringing ambitious new ideas to continue the Robins' progress on and off the pitch.

It did not take long for those ideas to bear fruit. The 2024-25 turned into the greatest season in the club's history with eight trophies won across all three teams.

Westlake led Hassocks to their first ever Southern Combination League title. Their 97 points was the joint-second-most of any champions in the 21st century.

The Robins finished 16 clear of runners up Crowborough Athletic, who they then beat 3-1 in the Peter Bentley League Cup final to secure the double. The Under 23s completed a treble of Southern Combination North Division champions, League Cup winners and County Cup winners. The Under 18s repeated the trick, lifting the Central Division, League Cup and Sussex Dennis Probee Youth Cup.

Winning the Southern Combination League sees Hassocks promoted into the Isthmian League South East Division for 2025-26, bringing step four football to the village for the first time.

I CAN'T have been the only one to notice a distinct change in the temperature over the last few weeks as the summer months passed and autumn set in.

With t-shirts and shorts now long packed away in the bottom of the wardrobe, woolly jumpers and thick coats are now the order of the day for bracing a cold afternoon or evening on the terraces.

The autumn and winter months can be difficult periods for Non-League clubs up and down the country. Storm Amy battered our shores and played havoc with the fixture scheduled a fortnight ago, while the likes of Bram, Chandra, Dave and Eddie brewing for the next instalment.

Indeed, echoes of past storms and multiple postponements that wiped out week-after-week of fixtures sprung to mind as I ventured to a Friday night fixture between Northern League Division One rivals Newcastle Blue Star and Horden Community Welfare a couple of weeks back.

Now, I can't have been the only one expected to arrive at Blue Star's KD Stadium to be told the fixture had fallen foul of the strong winds and heavy rainfall that had battered the north-east and beyond for large parts of the previous 24 hours.

Yet, to my surprise, it was very much business as usual as the two sides made their way out onto a playing surface which looked in pristine condition despite being battered in the hours leading up to the game.

Somehow, amidst howling wind and driving rain, an intriguing contest ensued with the points shared in a 1-1 draw.

Indeed, on reflection, a share of the spoils was quite fitting on a day where the real winners were the team of Blue Star volunteers who worked tirelessly, without any individual reward, to get the

game on in testing conditions.

But it wasn't just the ground staff at Scotswood who deserve credit.

Off the pitch, turnstiles were in use, pints were being pulled in the clubhouse, bins were being emptied, half-time draw tickets sold and the club shop manned.

Then, once the full-time whistle had been blown, the clean-up operation began, both in and outside of the stadium – tasks that the 243 in attendance wouldn't have given a second thought to.

This, of course, is indicative of everyday life at a Non-League club, whatever the level, and got me thinking just how invaluable volunteers are to the day-to-day running of our clubs and how they provide the foundations of their very existence.

Without them, there would be no football clubs, or if we did, they would be unrecognisable from what we can consider ourselves fortunate to have.

From the tea lady to the kitman, the bar staff, to those manning the turnstiles and sweeping up post-match - all are as essential as each other and deserve our utmost respect and appreciation.

Their work may go unnoticed, and they may well toil away with unseen hours of graft, but they remain as essential as those representing our clubs on the pitch and the management teams that guide them.

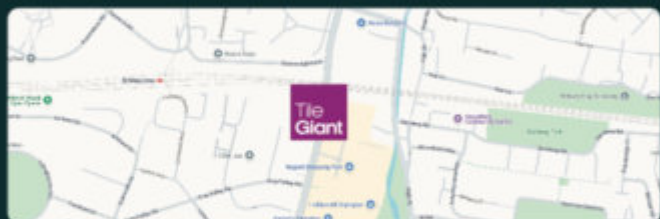
The winter months, as always, will be significant challenges as the bad weather descends - and that is when our volunteers come to the fore and go beyond the call of duty.

FA Youth Cup Report: Worthing U18s 0-2 Erith Town U18s

It was a nightmare start for the Rebels as they found themselves behind within the opening 90 seconds. They were masters of their own downfall, as Oliver Cowdrey's bouncing back pass was too difficult to control for goalkeeper Archie Short. Despite his best efforts, the shot-stopper couldn't prevent the ball from making its way over the line to gift the visitors the advantage.

After a nervy start, the hosts began to find some rhythm in the contest. A crucial intervention from centre-half Chris Loko saved his side from potential danger, before Josh Harland curled over the crossbar from the subsequent corner.

Brean Plaku then flashed a dangerous delivery across the box shortly after which reached Eddie Jimenez at the back post, but the forward couldn't sort out his feet in time to fashion an attempt on goal.

The Dockers approached the tie with bundles of energy and the Worthing defence were struggling to deal with the intensity at times. Skipper Jacob Corner

sent a wicked corner over Short and onto the forehead of full-back Teddy Miles, who inexplicably missed the target from a few yards out with 20 minutes on the clock.

Chiemeka Gurr-Enyl came close to equalising with a sliced half-volley which floated the wrong side of the post from a Worthing persuasion.

Opposing 'keeper Woody Leach was then called into action as he produced a solid stop to deny Eddie Jimenez, after the forward had been released by Will O'Brien.

The second period was largely uneventful as the Erith resistance held firm. Many attempts to break forward from the hosts were thwarted, with Loko particularly influential at the heart of their defence.

On the stroke of the 90th minute mark, the South-East London side sealed their progression into the First Round Proper as Fin Bowden was left unmarked and headed home from a corner.

Teddy Campbell was desperately unlucky not to score a spectacular third in the dying embers, with his swerving effort clipping the upright.

A sobering result for the young Rebels, who will undoubtedly learn from tonight's performance and channel their focus and energy into the league.

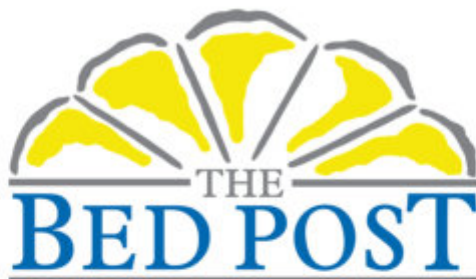

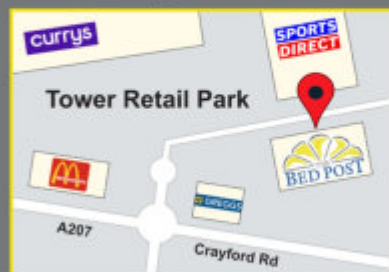
