HISTORY - CROWBOROUGH ATHLETIC



Crowborough Athletic FC, established in 1894 as a sporting extension of the local athletics club, has a fascinating history intertwined with the community. Initially sharing their name with a cricketing section, the club soon found its footballing identity and joined the Crowborough & District League (CDL) and the Sussex County FA in 1896.

Over the years, Crowborough Athletic FC showcased impressive performances in local leagues and competitions like the Humble-Crofts Cup and the George Dodd Memorial Trophy. They moved from various locations within the town before settling at the Alderbrook Playing Fields in 1953, thanks to the generous land contribution of Mr. George Watson.

The 1970s brought the club to the prestigious Sussex County Football League (SCFL), where they experienced ups and downs but consistently displayed determination. The 2003/04 season marked a turning point, with a promotion to Division 2 and a Division 3 Cup victory. The subsequent years saw continuous growth, culminating in a

historic promotion to the Ryman Isthmian League, Division 1, in the 2007/08 season.

Despite challenges, Crowborough Athletic FC's resilience remained steadfast, but they eventually returned to the SCFL Division 1 after one season in the Ryman Isthmian League.

Their transition to the Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL) in 2014 introduced new competition, where the club continued to progress.

The 2016/17 season saw an outstanding 32-game unbeaten run, nearly earning promotion back to the Ryman Isthmian League. Though they missed out on promotion, the Crows continued their upward trajectory, finishing third in the 2017/18 season.

Amidst challenges in subsequent seasons, including the impact of the global pandemic in 2019/20, the club remained proactive in ensuring the sustainability of football at the Crowborough Community Stadium. Major groundworks and new LED floodlights were installed through grants from the Football Foundation.

In the 2021/22 season, Crowborough Athletic FC focused on developing pathways from youth to senior football, achieving a commendable 10th place finish in the league and reaching the League Cup final. At the end of the season, they were moved back to the Southern Combination Football League (SCFL) by the FA. In the 2022/23 season, the club continued its progress, finishing 6th and reaching the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup final, and in the 2023/24 season, further progress resulted in a play-off place (finishing 3rd in league) and again reaching the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup final (losing to a 94th minute winner from the League Champions).

After a slow start to the 2024/25 season, The Crows improved on 23/24, winning the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup, and finishing 2nd in the League, gaining promotion through the Play-Offs this time to return to the Isthmian South East League at Step 4. The season ended with an appearance in the League Cup Final for an unlikely "treble" but they were beaten by the newly-crowned Champions.

2025/26 will see the First Team compete at Step 4 for only the second time in its history, while the club as a whole continues to develop new initiatives in the community, ready to face the new challenges ahead.

HARBOROUGH Town posted a great picture on their X account the morning after defeat to Carlisle United in the Isuzu FA Trophy.

Bees manager Mitch Austin was sat in an empty changing room, shooting the breeze with Carlisle manager – and Manchester United legend – Mark Hughes.

Austin's Southern Premier Central side had pushed the National League big guns all the way in a 2-1 loss.

It's not all that long ago Harborough were playing Step 5 football. It's not all that long ago Carlisle were celebrating promotion to League One.

Back-to-back relegations as seen the Cumbrians slip into Non-League and while their fans may not put the FA Trophy at the top of the priority list, the picture was a reminder of what a great competition it can be.

Yes, Harborough were knocked out but across last weekend's third round there were underdog stories to savour.

Take Clitheroe beating York City. The National League promotion hopefuls made a raft of changes but they needed hot-shot Ollie Pearce on the pitch to score an equaliser in the ninth minute of stoppage time to send the tie to penalties.

Clitheroe won out and manager Sean McConville – who has played in the EFL – was unable to contain his emotion at the result.

"I can't believe it," he said, choking back tears. "It's such an emotional day. I've got my son crying his eyes out. It means a lot." Up next is a trip to Scunthorpe United!

Anstey Nomads stunned Hartlepool 2-1 – Pools only grabbing a late consolation – which boss Conrad Logan labelled the best day in the club's history.

They will be looking to repeat the feat when they travel to FC Halifax Town in the New Year.

Walton & Hershaw dumped Sutton United out, too, on a busy day that showed us how the competition brings special moments every season.

There are just 32 clubs left on the road to Wembley – four more wins is all it takes to reach the big stage in May. In recent seasons we've seen Step 2 clubs make the final and, of course, Hornchurch even won it when they were at Step 3.

Perhaps it's too early still to start dreaming. But we're looking forward to seeing more memories made between now and Non-League Finals Day.

Starting as favourites for relegation, the club had a stunning run, winning the first 15 games and heading the table for all but a couple of weeks throughout the campaign, and on the last day of the season, sitting in 2nd place the Vickers defeated Romford FC 6-0 while leaders Witham Town could only draw their last game which saw them secure the title by a point, taking the club to the Premier Division at Step 3, its highest ever level in the pyramid.

The club struggled for a lot of the next season, but won the last 6 games to finish in 18th position to maintain their place in the division. Manager Tony Russell immediately resigned, joining Gray Wanderers FC in Division 1 and taking his entire side with him, but the club acted quickly to secure the services of Keith McMahon as new First Team Manager. Keith came with no players at the club and only a few weeks to the start of the 2015/2016 season. He worked tirelessly and brought in some excellent players, but despite some good performances they were unable to find the consistency needed in the Premier Division and were relegated back to Division One (North). A switch to the South Division was sensible and saw Keith lead them to some solid finishes over the next few campaigns.

Ahead of the 2020/21 season Nick Davis was appointed as the new manager but his first season in charge was cut short due to the Covid pandemic, with VCD sitting proudly in a play off place. In the next year

they finished 9th before Former VCD favourite Grant Basye was appointed, bringing with him former player Michael Power as his assistant, but Grant resigned near the end of the season with Michael taking over the reigns, and after a struggle we were unable to put a sustained run together resulting in our relegation to the SSEFL Premier Division after losing narrowly in a play off. Michael Power was released at the end of that season and the club quickly appointed Danny Joy and Ross Baker as joint managers, who took on the unenviable task of quickly getting together a new team. This gave us a lot of problems with an unsettled side in the early months, but in the run in we put together a number of excellent performances with the squad looking very accomplished.

With a number of new signings, the hope for the following season was to carry this on and push even further to make a serious challenge for the play off spots. Expectations were exceeded however when we spent the entire season occupying one of the top two league positions, finally conceding the title to Faversham Town. The lottery of the play-offs beckoned but we held our nerve, beating Funtab United 2-0 in the semi final, and then Fisher 2-1 in the final to clinch promotion back to the Isthmian League South East Division.

Under Danny Joy and Ross Baker's stewardship the club now looks to establish itself back at Step 4.

HISTORY - VCD ATHLETIC

The club eventually spent five seasons as tenants of Thamesmead Town before Lordswood FC kindly took their place for two seasons. Then the club embarked on a one year term with near neighbours Greenwich Borough. The club reached the final of the League Cup in 2002/2003, but were beaten 2-0 by Cray Wanderers. Further cup success followed in season 2005/2006 when the club reached the final of the Kent Senior Trophy for the second time, beating Tunbridge Wells 3-1 on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

During 2005 permission for floodlights and the development of the Oakwood ground was granted by Bexley Council. This enabled work to commence early in 2006. The pitch was levelled, rotated 90 degrees and re-laid. At the end of the 2007 season Martin Ford resigned as manager. Head coach Dean Frost took over as caretaker manager, and under his guidance the club obtained runners up spot in the league, narrowly missing out to Whitstable Town.

The following season Paul Foley was appointed manager of the first team, with Dean Frost reverting to his former position of head coach. Under their stewardship the club finished runners up once more. A year later, the club finally won the Kent League Premier Division title together with the Kent Senior Trophy, culminating in the long awaited promotion to the Ryman Football League at Step 4.

The first season was a success with an 8th place finish, but the club were left stunned when the Ryman League deemed ground issues warranted demolition. Midway through season 2012/2013 Ricky Bennett left the club due to outside pressures, and in his place the club secured the services of Tony Russell, and a magnificent record breaking run of 17 victories and 2 draws in the last 19 league fixtures enabled the club to gain promotion to the Ryman Football League Division One North.

VCD Athletic FC is one of only a few clubs to have originated during the Great War when, in 1916 it was formed by workers employed at the Vickers armaments factory in Crayford. The Company originally played only interdepartmental games until it was decided that the best players from the various sections would be elected to represent the firm. The club have played at the firm's sports ground, Oakwood, in Old Road, Crayford, from the outset right up to the present time.

Vickers (Erich) joined the re-formed Kent League in 1919, changing their name to Vickers (Crayford) a year later. In their first season in the Kent League they visited Maidstone United on Boxing Day and played in front of a crowd of 13,500.

The Vickers team that day contained seven Arsenal players who were finishing off their war service. It was a further 25 years before more silverware came their way, when they won the Kent Division One title in 1953. The Kent Amateur Cup was won in 1962 and in 1964 but the following season saw a spectacular slump and relegation, with a record of P24 W0 D2 L22, goals for 25, goals against 199.

In 1993, Martin Ford joined the club as manager and, in season 1995/1996 a unique cup treble was achieved with wins in the Kent Intermediate Shield, Kent County League Cup, and the Erith Hospitals Cup. Season 1996/1997 then saw the club win the Kent County Premier Division title for the first time in their history. Senior status was awarded that same year and a successful application was made to join the Kent League. The following season saw the club begin a ground-share with Thamesmead Town, finishing up in seventh place but also reaching the final of the Kent League Cup, where they lost 1-0 to Deal Town.

A season later the club beat Faversham Town 4-0 in the final to bring the club a first ever senior trophy, and the year after that the club made its third consecutive cup final appearance when they reached the final of the

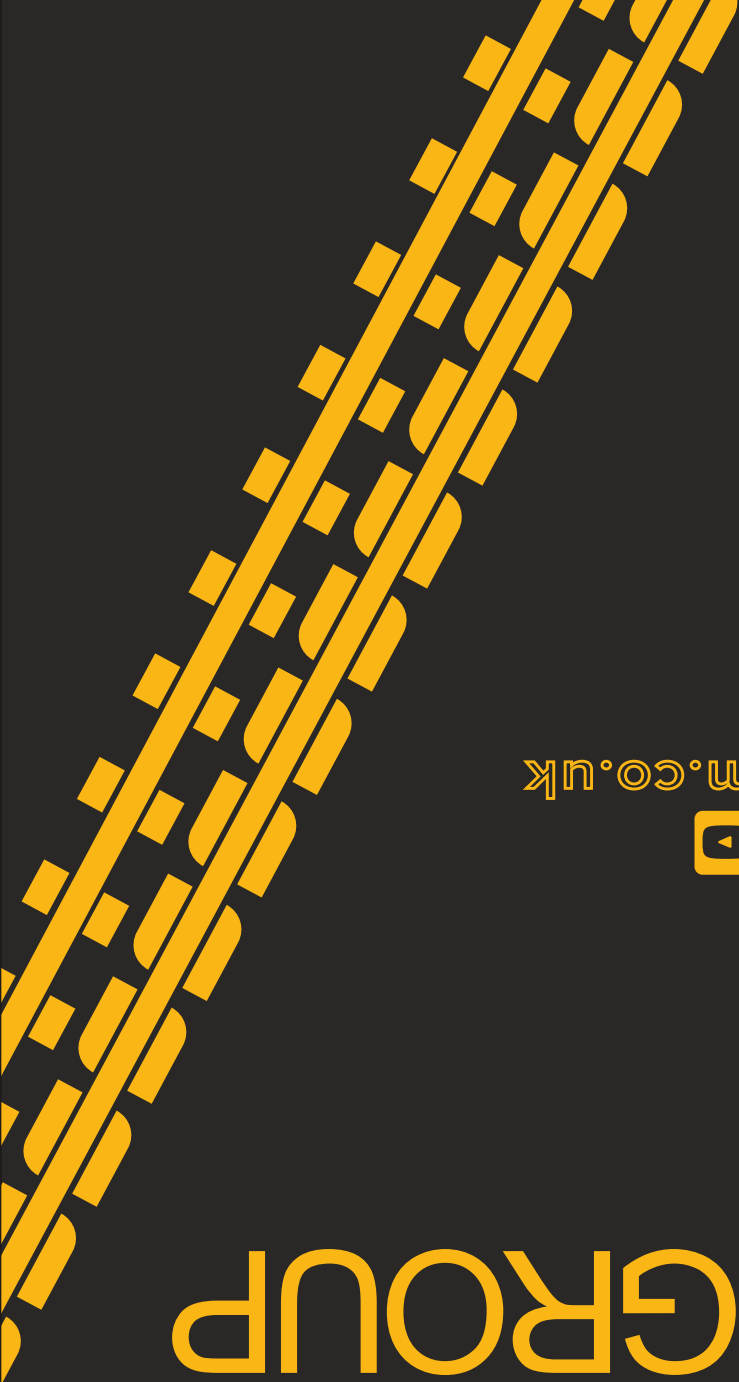
