Last weekend was a very busy weekend for the first team. It started on the Saturday with our 3pm game at home to Herne Bay. Despite a slow start we fashioned a number of clear cut chances but unfortunately failed to capitalise on them. Herne Bay on the other hand were restricted to just two shots in the half but they finished their opportunities clinically, and so it was that we went into the break two goals down having given ourselves a mountain to climb. The second half we started much the brighter, much more front-foot, and a sustained period of pressing combined with some good passing play eventually saw us pull a goal back through Elliott Duncan's sidefooted shot that beat their keeper on his left hand side. Herne Bay did manage to wrestle some control back after that and as we lost the momentum the goal brought the game drifted to a final score of 2-1

Bank Holiday Monday saw The Dockers make the short trip to local rivals VCD Athletic. Good exchanges of play early on saw them take the lead but Manny Oluwasemo equalised for Erith Town just five minutes later and we went into the break honours even. It remained that way through much of the second half but VCD took the lead towards the end of the game with a good shot from distance. We couldn't seem to lift ourselves after that and once again a tight game ended up with us on the wrong end of a 2-1 score line.

They were two narrow defeats, but I feel we should have taken something from the weekend. In my opinion, both games were quite even, but the overarching feeling is that we need to start taking our chances.

Today's game will be a severe test for our boys. We're playing a team that are a level higher than us and without doubt favourites to win their league. They have some very good players and we are going to have to be at our very best today if we have any chance of progressing in this competition.

Lets hear you get behind the lads today, we like it noisy, but avbove all I hope everyone has a good time and enjoys the game.

HISTORY - FARNHAM TOWN



through the merging of Farnham
Bungs (the Farnham Brewery) and the
Farnham star, the club was one of the
founder members of the London Spartan
League in 1975.

In the 1976-77 season they reached the fourth round of the FA Vase in the 1976-77 season. At the end of he 1979/80 season, Farnham Town left the London Spartan League and applied to the Combined Counties League. The club's application was accepted, finishing 4th in the first season, and the 1986-87 season saw Farnham take second place to Ash United in the league campaign.

The glory days finally arrived in the 1990-91 season when the club claimed the league title. In the 1991-92 season, the Town got a clean sweep of the major trophies by winning the Combined Counties Premier League, the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Dan Air Challenge Cup. Having won the league, the club applied and were accepted into the Diadora League, however funds for necessary ground improvements could not be generated and resulted in the club not having a league to participate in for the 1992-93 campaign.

Being accepted back into the Combined Counties League the following season, Farnham finished in the top six of the Premier Division for three consecutive seasons. Subsequent to this, the club suffered relegation from the Premier

Division in 2001 before bouncing straight back and then going onto endure four tough seasons in the Premier Division.

After four tough seasons of bottom four finishes, the club showed resilience in bouncing back again and then were crowned champions of Division One in 2007 under the guidance of Barry Bridger. With the ground not meeting the desired grading by the league, The Town were denied promotion again, having to spend another four seasons in Division One.

Clinching promotion in the 2010-2011 season after finishing second behind Worcester Park, Paul Tanner's first season at the helm saw the side gain automatic promotion to the Premier Division at the first attempt, having retained only four members of the side from the previous year's squad. Tanner's side also won the Combined Counties Fair Play Award for 2010-11 after not having a single player sent off for the whole season - a record to be proud of. In a very successful year for the club on the whole, Dean Nelson's reserve side finished second behind Mole Valley in the Combined Counties Reserve Division, improving on their fourth place finish the previous season. The ladies team also finished second in their respective league to cap quite a remarkable season in Geoff Chapple's final season as Chairman. In 2011, Ray Bridger took over as Chairman.

The team lifted the Cherry Red Records
Premier Challenge Cup in 2015-16 whilst

also reaching the final of the Aldershot FA Senior Cup.

The 2017-18 season was ultimately one of disappointment for the club. A good start saw the club go on its best run in the FA Vase in decades, the defeat of higher league opposition in the County Cup and reaching 12th place on the back of a long undefeated run by early November. However defeat in the last minute of the FA at The Memorial Ground in May 2023. Vase 2nd Round to Bridawater Town marked a significant turning point, not recording a single league win between 8th Balham 3-2 in extra-time as academy November and the season's end. This run led to the resignation of long-serving manager, Paul Tanner. Paul Bonner and then Emmanuelle Boudine were brought in to try and attempt to reverse the club's fortunes but alas it wasn't to be. The Town ended the season right at the foot of the table, being relegated back to Division One. The one highlight of the latter half of the semi-finals of the Aldershot Invitation

Cup, losing to eventual winners, Hartley Wintney.

After The Town welcomed Paul Johnson and Jimmy Hibburt to the Club in November 2022, it sparked a turnaround in the team that were hovering in mid-table. An exciting end of season run of 13 games unbeaten was joined by a run to the Southern Combination Cup final, which was hosted Over 1, 150 people piled in to watch Farnham come from 2-0 down to beat graduate Owen Dean sealed a remarkable hat-trick in the last minute of extra time.

With renewed optimism around the Club following the arrival of Paul Johnson and Jimmy Hibburt to manage the First Team, along with the support of new direction and investment from new director Harry Hugo, there are great plans to advance the Club the season however was the progression to both on and off the pitch that should excite the fans and local community.





Non-League Paper Programme Column by Matthew Badcock, Editor.

t's easy to forget quite how big the National League System is and the broad church it represents.

From huge ex-Football League clubs with seven-figure playing budgets for their season to very small community clubs run by a handful of volunteers. But that's what makes Non-League – and football in this country, generally – so unique and special.

You may have heard The FA last year introduced a new board to oversee this level of the game along with the women's pyramid.

We sat down with Head of National League System James Earl and National League System manager Matt Edkins to discuss all things Non-League for a three-part series in The NLP.

Don't miss this week's chat which covers club allocations, the pyramid's structure before we move into club licensing and technology the week after.

Last week we touched on the new National Leagues Pyramid Board, including the appointment of its first ever independent chair, Chris Brown.

"The important bit to say is it's still a fundamental moment where this level of the game in both the men's and the women's pyramid have a strong collective voice with a senior seat at the table at the FA," Earl told us.

"Historically, certainly the National League System has been positioned between the professional and the grassroots game and has sat in a governance structure that's been in and around the grassroots game.

"But there's been a recognition of the importance of the National League System – and the women's football pyramid – and that it is unique in how we should be servicing it at The FA. So its introduction last year for the first time was a really key moment.

"That has had challenges and opportunities. Challenges is bringing two pyramids together that have been governed separately.

"One of the pieces of work we've been doing is around the brand and identity for the board, but also the level of the game.

"So there has been some work done around a new brand and hopefully that will be launched soon, which will bring a collective identity for not just the board, but leagues and clubs and other stakeholders to stand behind.

"It has been important to not make the board a repeat of committees that still exist. The intent is to make this a strategic board that looks at the broader direction of travel for clubs and leagues and players at this level of the game.

"We've still got a journey to go on to really understand what it is we want the board to do to be able to drive standards up, not just in the competitions, but the club landscape as well.

"I think after a year there's been some great success. We've had some good debates and good conversations, but actually the proof will be in delivery and I think that's going to come over the next couple of years."
