ood afternoon everyone and welcome to the Stanmore Group Stadium for the first time in 2024.

We hope you all had an enjoyable festive season and wish you a Happy New Year.

This afternoon we are delighted to welcome Snodland Town as our visitors for the first time, in the Kent Senior Trophy quarter-finals.

We hope their players, officials and supporters enjoy their stay.

As a club they have made fantastic strides over the last ten years both on and off the pitch for which they should be congratulated.

Unfortunately a frozen pitch put paid to Tuesday's SCEFL fixture at home to Fisher, so we await a new date from the League.

Our own form has hit the buffers since a 5-1 home win against Sutton Athletic two days before Christmas.

Everyone in the squad needs to play their part, because everyone is good enough to affect the team and performances.

We travel to Holmesdale next Tuesday in the last eight of the League Cup before travelling to Kennington next weekend.

HISTORY - SNODLAND TOWN



ith the momentous decision in 2012 to amalgamate all the main adult and youth teams in the town under one club name - Snodland Town Football Club - football in Snodland has moved forward at a faster pace than at any time in its long and eventful past.

At the beginning of the 1986-87 season Snodland moved its home ground to Potyns Sports Ground at the Community Centre. The new venue had much improved facilities and marked the beginning of the club's transformation from village team to non-league football.

In 2012 the club acquired a lease from the local Town Council to enable development of its own ground. An ambitious development plan has since seen the ground transformed to meet Southern Counties East Football League standards including floodlighting, a 160-seat spectator stand, new dressing rooms and hospitality facilities. The ground has become the focal point for all the club's community activities.

Back in the late 1940's, when Snodland first began playing matches at the Recreation Ground as Snodland Minors FC, such facilities would, of course, never have been in anyone's mind. However, the founders of the Boys' club were ambitious and by 1955 had purchased land adjacent to the Rec and constructed modest changing facilities.

The Snodland Minors were established in

1948 and enjoyed considerable success. In 1954-55 Snodland won the Medway Minor League Cup, the League Challenge Cup and the Maidstone Minor League Cup.

In the 1956-57 season the boys' team evolved to a men's team and entered Division 3B of the Maidstone and District Football League and won the division without losing a game. The following season brought further success, with Snodland completing a double by winning division 2A and the League's Challenge Cup "B" competition. The club came runners up in Division 1 in 1958-59, and then won the newly christened "Maidstone Premier Division" in 1959-60 after a close fight against local rivals Wouldham FC.

Snodland also won the Kent Junior Cup "A" in 1961-62 and enjoyed further cup success in 1963-64 when the club won the Rochester League's Quarter Century Cup. In the mid-1960s Snodland spent five seasons in the Rochester League, with their best finish being runners-up in 1963-64. The Club returned to the Maidstone League in 1968-69, playing in Division 1. This was a period of rebuilding for the club, and it took until 1973-74 for Snodland to win the Division and return to the Premier Division.

The 1983-84 season saw Snodland complete a treble. After a wait of 23 years the club won the Maidstone Premier League, along with the Challenge Cup "A" and the Sittingbourne and Milton Charity Cup.

In season 1977/78 Snodland won both the Maidstone and District League's Challenge Cup B competition and the Kent Junior Cup B.

Their journey through the Kent County League started in the 1992-23 season and promotion to the Premier Division was won in 1998. The club's most successful season came a year later when the Premier Division title was won in front of a 300 strong crowd at home to eventual runners up, Bearsted.

In 2016 the club staged its first match in the Southern Counties East Football League, Division One, the highest level of football ever played in Snodland.

In the first full season following the Covid

pandemic we made it to the First Division Play-Offs, unfortunately losing the semi-final.

At the end of the 2022/23 campaign, they were promoted to the Premier Division of the Southern Counties East Football League as Champions of Division One and look forward to playing Step 5 football this season.

For the 2022/23 season they entered an Under 23 team in the SCEFL Development League. They also have their highly successful and ever expanding, Snodland Town junior and youth teams, enjoying success at every level, and their Reserves and Vets teams are established in the Kent County League.

The future is indeed bright for Snodland.

SCEFL - ROUND-UP



eal Town are the last SCEFL team remaining in the FA Vase after beating Cobham 2-0 on the Kent coast.

Ben Chapman gave them a 15th minute lead, with Rory Smith adding a second after the break.

Holmesdale's run came to an end with a 3-1 defeat at home to Highworth Town.

Luke Whelan's double early in the second half put Highworth in command, and despite Sam Bayford giving the Dalers hope with a 79th minute goal, Leon Morrison snuffed it out with the visitors' third.

Glebe remain top of the League following a 3-1 win at Punjab United on Saturday.

Former Dartford manager Jamie Coyle put them ahead before Rodney Eruotor added a second on the half hour.

Tom Hever added a third midway through the second half before Bilal Bourouf pulled one back.

New Faversham Towm manager Tommy Warrilow got off to a winning start as the Lilywhites came from a goal down to win at Rusthall.

Martin Youngah put the hosts ahead in the 22nd minute, but Warren Mfula's 63rd minute equaliser was followed by an own goal four minutes later.

Corinthian continued their title challenge with a 3-1 win at home to Whitstable Town.

Josh Williams gave the visitors a third minute lead, but Oscar Housego and Harry

Lashley scored in a two minute spell to put Michael Golding's side ahead at the break.

Sam Bewick got their third early in the second half

Bearsted have gone quietly along but are now fourth after a 5-2 win at Welling Town.

Ollie Freeman's 22nd minute opener for the Bears was cancelled out by a Seb Rowland goal, before Joel Wakefield restored the lead just before half-time.

Jordan Tingley and Jacob Kalonda put the result beyond doubt, with Alfie Craggs adding a fifth after an own goal had pulled one back for the Boots.

Snodland Town were also in the goals with a 5-2 win at Fisher, with five different scorers for the Snods.

Two points separate the bottom five, and Kennington missed the chance to move away after losing 3-1 at home to Lordswood.

Stansfeld remain bottom after a 3-1 defeat at home to Lydd Town with Dean Grant netting twice for the visitors.

Croydon are the first team in to the Kent Senior Trophy semi-finals after winning 2-0 at Hollands & Blair.

Uli Fischer and Athan Smith-Joseph were on target for the First Division side.

AFC Whyteleafe remain seven points clear in Division One after Taurean Roberts' double gave them a 2-1 win at Meridian VP.


