WELCOME - RUSTHALL FC

fter one point from the past three League games we return to the Stanmore Group Stadium looking to get our season back on track this afternoon.

Looking to stop us are Rusthall Football Club, whose players, officials and supporters we welcome here for the first time.

Since joining the SCEFL in 2017, Rusthall have constantly developed on and off the pitch and are greatly respected throughout the other clubs in this League.

The Rustics won 3-1 on their visit last season and come here on the back of a great win against VCD Athletic on Tuesday, so we know today will be a tough test.

Our last home game saw us exit the London Senior Cup in a 2-0 defeat to Dulwich Hamlet.

It certainly wasn't a bad performance, but the Isthmian Premier Division side had a bit too much for us on the night.

After having last weekend off we travelled to Fisher on Tuesday night.

Having made a bright start, during which Harry Taylor headed wide and James Dyer's effort was deflected inches past the post, we then conceded two poor goals from our point of view to go in 2-0 down.

Just as we seemed to be getting a foothold, their left-back hit a stunning goal to seemingly put the game out of reach.

Ryan Mahal's header looked little more than consolation, only for Henry Arnold to pull it back to 3-2 with a smart finish. As we pressed for the equaliser, Mackenzie Foley was penalised for handling when he looked to have been fouled.

We never managed to get the ball clear from that session of play and the Fish added a fourth.

On the night we could have no complaints and we move on.

There is still plenty of football to play and the squad are more than capable of returning to our early season form.

Since our last notes we have made two signings with Jake Lovell and Sam Smith joining from Greenways and Stansfeld respectively.

Jake was with us at the start of 2020-21 before moving on but returns having netted eight times for Greenways this season.

Sam is a right-back and will give us greater strength in the squad.

Welcome to both.

We are delighted to host "Back to School Day" this afternoon. It is another Community project and we hope the kids enjoy their afternoon.

Next week we travel to Holmesdale in the League before returning here to host Stansfeld on Tuesday 10th October.

HISTORY - RUSTHALL FC



Rushall were first registered with the Kent County Football Association on June 17th 1899 when the club joined the newly formed Tunbridge Wells League.

The 'Rustics' first success came in 1905 when the league was won in convincing style. The 1920's saw the club up among the best locally with the Kent Junior Cup Group 'A' being won in 1924. They were champions of the Tunbridge Wells League in 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926 and again in 1930.

The success continued through the 1930's with more league titles and another Kent Junior Cup in 1935.

The Rustics were unable to continue these successes after the War.

There were lean times for the club, and in the 1970's they were close to folding but just managed to keep going largely thanks to the hard work of then secretary Peter Smith, with just one side in the Tonbridge League.

The 1980's saw in influx of new young players and in 1982 the club won Division One of the Tonbridge League.

At this point Derek Seal took on the roll of Chairman. One of his first tasks was to get the club into the Kent Amateur (now Kent County) League and the club lifted the Division Two Title at the first attempt in 1983-84.

Success followed in the 1984-85 season when the Division One Title

was secured on the last day of the season with a 1-0 win at Paddock Wood.

After several embarrassing incidents at the Council owned Southwood Road recreation ground, the club obtained the use of a field at Jockey Farm in the village. After a lot of hard work by the committee, the ground met the League's ground grading criteria for Intermediate football. By now the club were running three senior sides.

An amalgamation with Rusthall Boys FC was a big step in making the club what it is today. The Rustics currently run three men's teams and close to 20 youth teams from Under 6 through to Under 18.

Work at Jockey Farm continues apace as the club strive to improve facilities, and a Directors lounge is now up and running and has been named the Derek Seal Suite, in memory of their late Chairman who had the idea to build a ground at Jockey Farm.

As soon as the 2016/17 season finished, contractors moved in and levelled the pitch and installed new drainage and the whole area was reseeded.

A new 125 seater stand is now installed and has been named in memory of former President Bob Woodhams, a new fence and path installed on the far side of the ground along with new dugouts, and both dressing rooms have been refurbished. The ground will now be called The Jockey Farm Stadium.

All this has been achieved by a small group of dedicated volunteers as the club strive to achieve their motto;

'TO BE THE BEST FOOTBALL CLUB POSSIBLE'

In the 2016/17 Season Rusthall finished in second place in the SCEFL First Division. This meant promotion to the Premier where the following year they luckily held onto their place at this level despite finishing in 19th place.

The following season there was no such luck though, as another 19th place finish saw the club relegated to the First Division.

A quick return was only denied by the Coronovirus Pandemic - when the

season was declared null and void with the Club in an excellent position for promotion.

With the same happening again in 2020/21 the FA chose to combine results from the two unfinished seasons to reward the best performers, and this meant they were granted promotion and a place back in the Premier Division for the 2021/22 campaign.

Relegation was narrowly averted in their first year back at Step 5 but 2022/23 provided them with an excellent 6th placed finish.

They now go into 2023/24 excited by what is in store for their Club.

here were no changes in the top four on Tuesday as all of the incumbents won.

Leaders Glebe won their derby game at home to Holmesdale.

Malachi Morris scored the only goal of the first half.

With fifteen minutes remaining, Jamie Philpot made it 2-0 from the spot, before Theo McKenzie pulled one back four minutes from time.

Corinthian piled on the misery for struggling Welling Town with a 4-0 win at Gay Dawn Farm.

Charlie Clover completed a hat-trick in the 89th minute with Ross Obazee adding the fourth a minute later.

Fisher's 4-2 win over the Dockers kept them in third spot.

Faversham Town put the disappointment of their FA Vase expulsion behind them to beat Kennington 2-1.

The Lilywhites were removed from the competition for playing a loan player in their win over Horsham YMCA in the first qualifying round in breach of competition rules.

It should be said that it was a completely inadvertent error on the part of the club.

Warren Mfula gave them a 41st minute lead at Salters Lane, but Kennington levelled on the stroke of half-time through Craig Calvert. Stefan Payne scored the decisive goal eight minutes after the break.

Punjab United moved into the top five after beating Tunbridge Wells 2-1 at home.

Lea Dawson gave Punjab a 20th minute lead with Cruis Nyadzayo grabbing the 69th minute winner, five minutes after Jack Walder levelled for Wells.

Former Punjab striker Will Johnson-Cole netted both goals for Bearsted as they beat Snodland Town 2-0 at Honey Lane.

After a disappointing start Deal Town are finding their form and won a third League game in a row at Hollands & Blair.

Billy Munday, Ben Chapman and Elliott Moore were on target in a 3-1 win at Darland Avenue, with Harvey Welford replying at the death for the hosts.

Rusthall came from a goal down to beat VCD Athletic 3-1 at Jockey Farm.

Jess Duah-Kessie put the Vickers ahead in the 15th minute, but Jack Lyons and Reece Deakin put the Rustics ahead at half-time.

Tarik Ibrahim's 68th minute goal piled on the misery for the visitors who suffered a sixth defeat in nine games since relegation last season.

The Meridian derby saw Valley Park draw 1-1 at home to Bridon Ropes.

All the goal action came in the first three minutes of the second half with Christian Ibitoye's opener for Meridian cancelled out by a Jordan Downes effort just a minute later.






