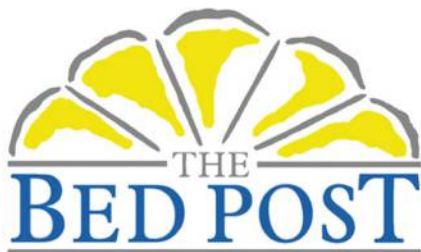

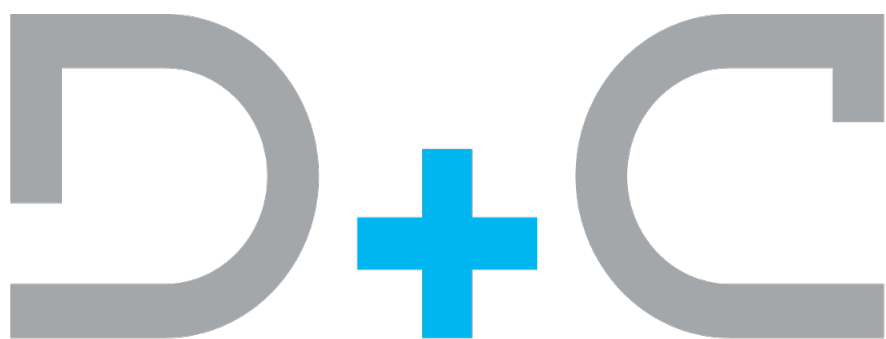

CROWBOROUGH ATHLETIC

## **Good afternoon everyone and welcome one again to Erith Stadium.**

Today it's our pleasure to welcome the players officials and supporters of Crowborough Athletic for our SCEFL Premier Division encounter.

Our meeting here last season ended in a 2-1 win for the Dockers with Steadman Callender scoring both of our goals.

Should he start the game this afternoon it will be his 100th start in an Erith Town shirt - a fantastic achievement in the modern non-league game where players come and go so quickly.

Our trip to Crowborough last season was our last away game before the season was prematurely ended and we picked up a point from an entertaining 2-2 draw.

Since our last notes we have seen two contrasting performances.

An injury to keeper Lewis Collier in the warm up against AFC Croydon meant that Ryan Mahal had to go between the posts at the last minute.

Not only is credit due to him for a clean sheet, but the whole team for the way they protected him.

A 2-0 win was comfortable in the end with two well worked and taken goals on the night.

From there we went to Kennington in the FA Vase and turned in a performance that was below the level we have come to expect or are capable of.

It was always going to be a hard game against a side who are flying high in Division One and we were beaten by a side who were quicker to the ball, played with greater tempo and deserved to progress,

You only get one life in the cup so it is a bitter pill to swallow but it is now up to everyone to get their teeth in to the League campaign and pick up as many points as we can while others are in Cup competitions.

Two wins from three is a promising start and we need to build on that, starting from today.

Following today's game we hit the road with a trip to Balham on Wednesday and Bearsted next Saturday.

Our next home game is against Fisher on Wednesday week, 7th October.

Last Wednesday saw our youth team progress to the second qualifying round of the FA Youth Cup with a 2-1 win at home to Hastings United.

For our lads, who are in their first year at this level, it was a fantastic achievement against an older and physically more developed Hastings side.

The application shown on the night was something they should be proud of.

Their reward is a home tie against K Sports or Meridian VP who were due to meet on Thursday evening.

We will confirm the date as soon as we have it.

# IT'S HISTORY

**Crowborough Athletic FC were formed in 1894 and played in various leagues around the area for many years.**

The club also had a few "homes" it would seem during its lifetime before settling at the Alderbrook Recreation Ground sometime in the early 1950's.

As for the club's recent history there are records which can be seen which shows the club being elected to the Sussex County Football League (SCFL), Division 2 for season 1974/75 having been playing in the Tunbridge Wells League and, it is believed, the Southern Counties Championship for quite a few seasons.

The first season in the SCFL, Division 2 saw the club finish in fourth position with a record of played 22, won 9, drew 7 and lost 6, scoring 38, conceding 36 for a points total of 25 ( 2 points for a win).

During the next nine seasons the club were more middle to bottom in the division rather than going for promotion. In the 1976/77 season the club finished second from bottom but were saved from having to leave the league as it was expanded from 12 clubs to 15 for the 1977/78 season .

It was season 1986/87 that saw the club start to rebuild itself. as the club finished runners-up in Division 3 to Langney Sports, now Eastbourne Borough, to gain promotion back to Division 2 and also won the Sussex Intermediate Cup for the first time.

The club spent the next five seasons in Division 2 with mixed success. The club finished ninth in Division 2, out of 17 teams,

in the 1991/92 season but little did anyone know that a higher finish would be achieved the following season.

There were two outstanding teams in Division 2 for the 1992/93 season, one was Crowborough Athletic and the other was Stamco, and it was the Crows who finished as champions to gain promotion to Division 1 for the first time in its history with the SCFL..

It was ironic that both teams last game of the season was at the Alderbrook and against each other, where the Crows ran-out 3-2 winners to win the title and promotion.

The stay in Division 1 was to last three seasons as the club found it a struggle to survive in the top-flight for seasons 1993/94, 1994/95 until the club finished bottom of Division 1 in the 1995/96 season.

The club held their own back in Division 2 for the 1996/97 and 1997/98 seasons but the decline from the heady heights of Division 1 back to Division 3, was confirmed in season 1998/99 as the club finished next to bottom again and were relegated.

The 1999/00 season was rather a bizarre one for the Crows in many ways as they finished fourth in Division 3 but with promotion, relegation and a club leaving the SCFL the Crows were promoted back to Division 2 after only one season.

The club were not ready for Division 2 in the 2000/01 season and this was confirmed when the Crows finished second from bottom and were relegated back to Division 3 yet again with a grand total of 25 points.

The season 2001/02 brought some success to the club as the Division 3 cup was won and finished in fourth position.

The next season, 2002/03, saw the Crows finish third in Division 3, 2 points behind the second place team.

Season 2003/04 was one of the most successful it has ever had as promotion back to Division 2 was secured rather easily as they finished 11 points ahead of second placed St. Francis Rangers and the Division 3 Cup was won again for the second time in three seasons.

The club found themselves back in Division 2 and this time it was only in Division 2 for the 2004/05 season, but because of a second successive promotion.

The next three seasons, were very successful for the Crows and a trophy was also added to the collection in this season as the club won the SCFL League Cup.

The highlight of the Crows membership of the SCFL though came in the 2007/08 season as the Division 1 title only time so far in the clubs history which meant it could apply to join the Ryman Isthmian League.

The stay in the Ryman Isthmian League, South Division, was short lived as the club were relegated after just one season so it was back to the SCFL Division 1 for the 2009/10 season.

After the end of the 2013/14 season, in which the club finished 6th in the league and reached the League Challenge Cup Final, the FA League Committee decided to carry out a lateral move within the Step 5 level and this saw the club move from the Sussex County Football League and join the Southern Counties East League.

Season 2014/15 proved to be a journey of ups and downs and both the club, and a mid-table 10th place was achieved come the end of the season.

The club exceeded their expectations and finished the 2015/16 season in 7th place.

For the 2016/17 the Crows found themselves with stronger squad than the season before, it had plenty of experience and talent and the competition for places in the starting eleven was fierce indeed.

With the players brought in, added to the ability already there, the club had a great season, doing well in all cup competitions, had a 32 game unbeaten run and finished runners up to SCEFL winners, Ashford United, therefore, promotion was missed by just two points.

Another close Season was to come in 2017-18 as Crows finished in 3rd place with the top two teams both getting promoted! Behind the scenes there were many hurdles to overcome in the 2018/19 season but the club were never in danger before sealing a mid-table finish.

Corinthian knocked out Bostik League Sevenoaks Town 3-1 at Gay Dawn.

Emmanuel Oloyede and Louie Clarke both netted for the second game in a row as the Hoops progressed.

Deal Town went agonisingly close at Chipstead, taking a 75th minute led through Kane Smith.

The Bostik League side levelled with just three minutes remaining before winning on penalties.

Tunbridge Wells went out at Haringey Borough, losing 5-1 at the Bostik Premier Division side.

Erith & Belvedere also had a hard night as they lost 5-0 at Hartley Wintney.

Fisher's run also ended despite a brave performance at Cray Wanderers.

The Fish were level at the break but went down 3-1 to two second half goals at Hayes Lane.
